



This mini bag is ideal for holding everything you need for Christmas parties. The icy colour palette of blues, purples and pinks is also perfect for a wintry look.



Festive fractals

Take your winter style into a new dimension with clothing and accessories that will have you in a twirl



HEELING ENERGY

These are no normal socks – every time you lift your foot, a fantastic spiral appears on your heel! We love a piece with a fun secret detail like this. And, best of all, they make for a practical yet unique festive gift!

ROUND WE GO

The pinwheel shape on this jumper seems to almost move and twirl with you. With a dynamic design, timeless colours and a relaxed shape, this sweater is a real stand-out piece for your winter wardrobe.







WINTER WAVES

Ever-increasing rows of crochet erupt into ripples in this delightfully wavy scarf. The triangular motifs come together perfectly for a chaotic yet natural finish.

TWIRL GIRL

Zany spirals drip from a hair tie in this fashionable finish. The mottled shades used here give it depth, but you can also swap them out for festive sparkles!



CLUTCH BAG

Nature, meet fashion. This ammonite-esque mini bag by Alice Tarry will bring you out of your shell at any festive social event

- Scheepjes Metropolis (75% wool, 25% nylon, 50g/200m), 1 ball of each: Dubai (047), Sydney (048), Ulsan (015), Lahore (014), Glasgow (002)
- A 3.5mm (US E/4) hook
- A 4mm (US G/6) hook
- A stitch marker

TENSION

Centre Circle measures 7cm (2¾in) in diameter using a 4mm hook

MEASUREMENTS

Bag measures 22cm (8¾in) wide

NOTES

This pattern works with 2 strands of yarn held together as one throughout. The Bag is made from 2 Centre Circles. Circles are joined together when working the Shell. The Handle is worked off the Bag at the end. Parts of this pattern are worked using the amigurumi method. Work stitches in a continuous spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as you work.

CLUTCH BAG

CENTRE CIRCLE (MAKE 2)

Using a 4mm hook and with Dubai and Sydney

held together, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), 8htr in loop. [8 sts]

Round 2 2htr in each st around. [16 sts]

Round 3 (Htr in next st, 2htr in next st) 8 times. [24 sts]

Round 4 (2htr in next st, htr in next 2 sts) 7 times, 2htr in next st, htr in next st, dc in next st, ss to first htr to join. [32 sts]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Using a 3.5mm hook and Glasgow, with RS facing, join to the centre of the magic loop. Surface ss in each st around to make a spiral.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

SHELL

Using a 4mm hook and with Glasgow and Lahore held together, with WS facing, join with a ss to the seventh from last st of Round 4 of first Centre Circle, ch27, with WS facing ss in last st of Round 4 of second Centre Circle.

Row 1 (RS) Ch1, ss in next ch, dc in next 3 ch, htr in next 4 ch, tr in next 5 ch, dtr in next ch, tr in next 5 ch, htr in next 4 ch, dc in next 3 ch, ss in next ch, ss next unworked st of Round 4 of first Centre Circle, turn. [27 sts]

Row 2 Ch1, (working in bl only) ss in next st, dc in next 25 sts, ss in next st, ss in next unworked st of Round 4 of second Centre Circle, turn. Change to Lahore and Ulsan.

Row 3 Ch1, (working in bl only) ss in next st, dc in next 3 sts, htr in next 4 sts, tr in next 5 sts, dtr in next st, tr in next 5 sts, htr in next 4 sts, dc in next 3 sts, ss in next st, ss next unworked st of Round 4 of first Centre Circle, turn.

Row 4 Ch1, (working in bl only) ss in next st, dc

in next 25 sts, ss in next st, ss in next unworked st of Round 4 of second Centre Circle, turn.

Change to Ulsan and Sydney.

Rows 5-6 As Rows 3-4.

Change to Sydney and Dubai.

Rows 7-8 As Rows 3-4.

Change to Sydney and Ulsan.

Rows 9-10 As Rows 3-4.

Change to Ulsan and Lahore.

Rows 11-12 As Rows 3-4.

Change to Lahore and Glasgow.

Rows 13-14 As Rows 3-4.

Change to Lahore and Ulsan.

Rows 15-50 As Rows 3-14 three times more.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

HANDLE

Pm in 14th foundation ch and the 14th st of Row 50 of Shell.

Using Lahore and Glasgow held together, with RS facing, join with ss in st 2 sts to right of marker in foundation ch of Shell, ch27, ss in st left of marker in Row 50 of Shell.

Row 2 Dc in next 27 ch, ss in st next to marker in foundation ch of Shell, ss in next st, turn. [27 sts]

Row 3 Dc in next 27 sts, ss in marked st of Row 50 of Shell, ss next st, turn.

Row 4 Dc in next 27 sts, ss in next 2 unworked sts of foundation ch of Shell, turn.

Row 5 Dc in next 27 sts, ss in next unworked st of Row 50 of Shell.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

HEADBAND

Feel like your head is spinning? It might just be the beautiful spirals on this motif headband designed by Alice Tarry

■ Scheepjes Metropolis (75% wool, 25% nylon, 50g/200m), 1 ball of each: Dubai (047), Sydney (048), Ulsan (015), Lahore (014), Glasgow (002)

- A 3.5mm (US E/4) hook
- A stitch marker



TENSION

A single Square measures 8cm (3in) using a 3.5mm hook, or size needed to obtain correct tension.

MEASUREMENTS

Headband measures 10cm (4in) wide and 55cm (21¾in) circumference

ABBREVIATIONS

reverse dc Insert hook in next st to right (or left if left-handed), yrh and pull up a loop, yrh and pull through 2 loops on hook

NOTES

You will be working with 3 colours at the same time, carry the unused colours through the stitches.

The 6 Squares will be joined into a strip, which will be joined at the ends. The Edging is then worked around each edge.

HEADBAND

SQUARE (MAKE 6)

Make 3 in each colourway.

Using Dubai (Ulsan), make a magic loop.

Round 1 Ch2 (does not count as a st), (tr, change to Lahore, tr, change to Glasgow, tr,

change to Dubai (Ulsan)) 4 times in loop, ss to first tr to join. [12 sts]

Round 2 Ch3 (counts as tr throughout), *(tr, change to Lahore, tr) in next st, (tr, change to Glasgow, tr) in next st, (tr, change to Dubai (Ulsan), tr) in next st; rep from * twice more, (tr, change to Lahore, tr) in next st, (tr, change to Glasgow, tr) in next st, tr in next st, ss to top of beg-ch-3 to join. [24 sts]

Round 3 Ch3, tr in same st, (change to Dubai (Ulsan), tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, change to Lahore, tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, change to Glasgow, tr in next st, 2 tr in next st) 3 times, change to Dubai (Ulsan), tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, change to Lahore, tr in next st, 2 tr in next st, change to Glasgow, tr in next st, ss to top of beg-ch-3 to join. [36 sts]

Round 4 Ss in next st, ch3, tr in next st, 2tr in next st, (change to Dubai (Ulsan), tr in next 2 sts, 2tr in next st, change to Lahore, tr in next 2 sts, 2tr in next st, change to Glasgow, tr in next 2 sts, 2tr in next st) 3 times, change to Dubai (Ulsan), tr in next 2 sts, 2tr in next st, change to Lahore, tr in next 2 sts, 2tr in next st, ss to top of beg-ch-3 to join. [48 sts]

Fasten off.

Round 5 Join Sydney, ch1 (does not count as st throughout), *dc in next 4 sts, htr in next 2 sts, tr in next st, (tr, dtr) in next st, ch 3, (dtr, tr) in next st, tr in next st, htr in next 2 sts; rep from * 3 times more, ss to first dc to join. [56 sts]

Round 6 Ch1, *dc in next 9, (dc, htr, dc) in ch-3 sp, dc in next 5; rep from * 3 times more, ss to first dc to join. [68 sts]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

TO MAKE UP

Lay one Square of each colourway RS facing and work a row of dc through both layers from corner htr to corner htr. Continue joining Squares alternating the colours, until you have

a strip of 6. Fold the strip RS facing and join the first square to the last square with a row of dc sts. Now turn so RS is facing.

EDGING (MAKE 2)

Using Sydney, join to any st along edge.

Round 1 Ch1, dc in each st around, ss to first dc to join. [96 sts]

Round 2 Ch1, reverse dc in each st to end, ss to first dc to join. [96 sts]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

SOCKS

Step into something stunning with these swirl-heeled socks by Nicki Byrnes – they're subtle enough to wear in the workplace but cool enough to act as a fashion statement

■ Scheepjes Metropolis (75% wool, 25% nylon, 50g/200m), 2 balls of each: Dubai (047), Sydney (048), Ulsan (015), Lahore (014)

- A 3.5mm (US E/4) hook
- Stitch markers



TENSION

16 sts and 10 rounds measure 10x10cm (4x4in) over treble crochet using a 3.5mm hook, or size needed to obtain correct tension

MEASUREMENTS

To fit UK size 4-6 (US size 6-8)

Foot circumference measures 20cm (8in)

ABBREVIATIONS

ltr (linked treble) Insert hook in horizontal bar at centre of previous st, yrh and pull up a loop, insert hook in next st, yrh and pull up a loop, (yrh and pull through 2 loops) twice.

fdc (foundation double crochet) Ch2 (does not count as st), insert hook in last ch from hook,





yrh and pull up a loop, pull through one loop on hook (loop will sit at base of fdc), pull through 2 loops on hook *insert hook in loop at base of prev fdc, yrh and pull up a loop, pull through one loop on hook (loop will sit at base of fdc), pull through 2 loops on hook

NOTES

Socks are worked beginning with the Heel. Heel is worked in a combination of rows and rounds. The Leg and Foot are worked in continuous rounds off the Heel. Work stitches in a spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as you work.

Socks are worked with 2 strands of yarn held together as one throughout.

To achieve the spiral effect on the Heel and Toe, you will switch between 2 colours. The unused colour is placed on a marker until directed to use again.

SOCKS

HEEL

Using Ulsan, make a magic loop.

Row 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), (dc, htr, tr) in loop, place live loop on marker. [3 sts]

Work continues in rounds.

Join Sydney into magic loop.

Round 2 (Dc, htr, tr) in loop, working into sts

from Row 1, 3ltr in next dc, ltr in next st, 3ltr in next st, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Ulsan. [10 sts]

Round 3 3ltr in next dc, ltr in next st, 3ltr in next st, (ltr in next 2 sts, 3ltr in next st) twice, ltr in next st, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Sydney. [18 sts]

Round 4 (Ltr in next 2 sts, 3ltr in next st) twice, (ltr in next 4 sts, 3ltr in next st) twice, ltr in next 2 sts, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Ulsan. [26 sts]

Round 5 (3ltr in next st, pm in second ltr, ltr in next 12 sts) twice, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Sydney. [30 sts]

Round 6 (Ltr in each st to marker, 3ltr in marked st, move marker up to second ltr) rep around, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Ulsan. [34 sts]

Round 7 (Ltr in each st to marker, 3ltr in marked st, move marker up to second ltr) rep around, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Sydney. [38 sts]

Round 8 (Ltr in each st to marker, 3ltr in marked st, move marker up to second ltr) rep around, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Ulsan. [42 sts]

Heel is completed in rows. The beginning of the rows are worked to get to the position of the increases; the row will then work over half of the sts.

Row 9 Ltr to marker, 3ltr in marker, ltr in next 20 sts, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Sydney.

Row 10 Ltr to marker, 3ltr in marker, ltr in next 20 sts, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Ulsan.

LEG

Change to Dubai.

Round 1 (RS) 23fdc working from base of last st in Ulsan, 23ltr in each Ulsan st from Row 9 of Heel. [46 sts]

Round 2 (RS) Tr in each st around.

Round 3 *(Tr2tog), pm in last st, tr in next 21 sts; rep from * once more. [44 sts]

Round 4 *(Tr2tog), pm in last st, tr in next 20 sts; rep from * once more. [42 sts]

Round 5 *(Tr2tog), pm in last st, tr in next 19 sts; rep from * once more. [40 sts]

Round 6 *(Tr2tog), pm in last st, tr in next 18 sts; rep from * once more. [38 sts]

Round 7 *(Tr2tog), pm in last st, tr in next 17 sts; rep from * once more. [36 sts]

Rounds 8-11 Tr in each st around.

Round 12 Tr in first 26 sts, htr in next 5 sts, dc in next 5 sts, ss to beg tr.

Fasten off.

FOOT

Pick up live loop of Sydney from end of Heel on hook, change to Lahore.

Round 1 (RS) (Tr3tog, pm in dec, tr in next 20 sts) twice. [42 sts]

Round 2 Tr3tog, tr in each st to next marker, tr3tog, tr in each st to end. [38 sts]

Round 3 Tr2tog, tr in each st to next marker,



tr2tog, tr in each st to end. [36 sts]

Rounds 4-11 Tr in each st around.

You can work fewer or additional rounds here, to adapt the length of the foot.

Round 12 Tr in next 26 sts, htr in next 5 sts, dc in next 5 sts, ss in beg tr.

Fasten off.



CUFF

Join Sydney in any st from Round 12 of Leg. Tip: line the join up with the increases on final round of Heel to position seam at side.

Row 1 (RS) Ch6, dc in second ch from hook and next 4 ch, ss in next st from Round 12, change to Ulsan, ss in next st from Round 12, turn.

[5 sts, 2 ss]

Row 2 (WS) Skip 2 ss, dc in bl of next 5 sts, turn. [5 sts]

Row 3 Ch1, dc in bl of next 5 sts, ss in next st from Round 12, change to Sydney, ss in next st from Round 12, turn. [5 sts, 2ss]

Rep Rows 2-3, alternating between Ulsan and Sydney every 2 rows, until all sts from Round 12 have been worked into.

With RS facing, ss the final row to base of Row 1.

Fasten off.

TOE

Pm in line with sides of the sock, with 17 sts between each marker. Move markers up as you work.

Join Ulsan in either marked st.

Round 1 (RS) *Ch2 (counts as ltr), tr2tog, ltr to 3 sts before next marker, tr2tog**, place live loop

on marker, join Sydney in next st; rep from * to **. [32 sts]

Round 2 With Sydney, *ltr in marked st, tr2tog next 2 sts, ltr to 2 sts before next marker, tr2tog**, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Ulsan; rep from * to ** once more. [28 sts]

Round 3 With Ulsan, ltr in marked st, tr2tog, ltr to 2 sts before next marker, tr2tog**, place live loop on marker and pick up loop of Sydney; rep from * to **. [24 sts]

Round 4 As Round 2. [20 sts]
Continue with Ulsan.

Row 5 Ltr in next 10 sts, turn so WS is facing and ss the opening closed.

Fasten off.

TO FINISH

Weave in all ends. For best results, block Socks.

SCARF

Like lichen on a rock by the seaside, the rippling motifs in this scarf by Joanne Fowler seem to grow ever outward

■ Scheepjes Metropolis (75% wool, 25% nylon, 50g/200m), 1 ball of each: Dubai (047), Sydney (048), Ulsan (015), Lahore (014) Glasgow (002), Manila (012)

■ A 3.75mm (US F/5) hook

TENSION

Tension is not critical, but it may affect the yarn quantities required

MEASUREMENTS

Scarf measures approx 152cm (60in) long

ABBREVIATIONS

fdc (foundation double crochet) Insert hook in first ch from hook, yrh and pull up a loop, yrh and pull through 1 loop (loop will sit at base of foundation st), yrh and pull through 2 loops on hook, *insert hook at base of prev foundation st, yrh and pull up a loop, yrh and pull through 1 loop, yrh and pull through 2 loops; rep from * as required



fhtr (foundation half treble) Yrh, insert hook in second ch from hook, yrh and pull up a loop, yrh and pull through 1 loop (loop will sit at base of foundation st), yrh and pull through 3 loops, *yrh, insert hook at base of prev foundation st, yrh and pull up a loop, yrh and pull through 1 loop, yrh and pull through 3 loops; rep from * as required

ftr (foundation treble) *Yrh, insert hook in loop at base of prev foundation st, yrh and pull up a loop, yrh and pull through 1 loop (loop will sit at base of foundation st), (yrh and pull through two loops) twice; rep from * as required

fdtr (foundation double treble) *Yrh twice, insert hook in loop at base of prev foundation st, yrh and pull up a loop, yrh and pull through 1 loop (loop will sit at base of foundation st), (yrh and pull through two loops) 3 times; rep from * as required

v-st (Tr, ch1, tr) in st/sp indicated

NOTES

Scarf is made up of 17 Motifs. Motifs are worked in rounds with RS facing throughout.

You can use any colour in any order for Rounds 1-5, changing colour as directed. Use Glasgow for the final row and all joining on each Motif. The Motifs are designed to curl at the edge. Block the Motifs at the end of Round 5, before working the JAYG round.

You can adapt the length by working more Motifs. This may affect yarn quantity required.

SCARF

MOTIF (MAKE 17)

Using any colour, ch6.

Round 1 (RS) 5fdc, 5ftr, 5ftr, ch1, 1fdtr, (ch1, dtr in base of fdtr) 4 times, rotating to work in opposite side of foundation sts, ch1, tr in base of next 5 tr, htr in base of next 5 htr, dc in base of next 5 dc, ss in bl of next 5 ch. [40 sts, 6 ch-1 sps] Change colour.

Round 2 (RS) (Work in bl throughout), ss in next 5 ch, dc in next 5 sts, htr in next 5 sts, tr in next 5 sts, dtr in next ch-sp, tr in bl of next st (ch1, dtr in ch-sp, ch1, tr in bl of next st) 4 times, dtr in ch-sp, tr in next 5 sts, htr in next 5 sts, dc in next 5 sts, ss in next 5 sts, ch2, ss to beg ss. [51 st, 8 ch-1 sp, 1 ch-2 sp]

Fasten off.

Join next colour in second ch of ch-2 sp.

Round 3 (Work in bl throughout), ss in second ch of ch-2 sp, ss in next 5 sts, dc in next 5 sts, htr in next 5 sts, tr in next 7 sts, dtr in ch-sp, tr in next st, (ch1, dtr in ch-sp, ch1, tr in next st) 6 times, dtr in ch-sp, tr in next 7 sts, htr in next 5 sts, dc in next 5 sts, ss in next 5 sts, ss in next ch, ch2, ss to beg ss. [61 st, 12 ch-1 sps, 1 ch-2 sp]

Fasten off.

Join next colour in second ch of ch-2 sp.

Round 4 (Work in bl throughout), ss in second ch of ch-2 sp, ss in next 6 sts, dc in next 5 sts, htr in next 5 sts, tr in next 9 sts, dtr in ch-sp, tr in next st, (ch1, dtr in ch-sp, ch1, tr in next st) 10 times, dtr in ch-sp, tr in next 9 sts, htr in next 5 sts, dc in next 5 sts, ss in next 6 sts, ss in next ch, ch2, ss to beg ss. [75 st, 20 ch-1 sps, 1 ch-2 sp]

Fasten off.

Join next colour in second ch of ch-2 sp.

Round 5 (Work in bl throughout), ss in second ch of ch-2 sp, ss in next 7 sts, dc in next 5 sts, htr in next 5 sts, tr in next 11 sts, dtr in ch-sp, tr in next st, (ch1, dtr in ch-sp, ch1, tr in next st) 18 times, dtr in ch-sp, tr in next 11 sts, htr in next 5 sts, dc in next 5 sts, ss in next 7 sts, ss in next ch, ch2, ss to beg ss. [97 st, 36 ch-1 sps, 1 ch-2 sp]

Join next colour in second ch of ch-2 sp.

Fasten off.

Block Motifs if desired (this is recommended).

Join Glasgow in second ch-1 sp.

Row 6 Ch3, (v-st in next st, ch1, skip ch-sp) 32 times, v-st in next st, ch3, ss in next ch-sp. [33 v-sts]

Fasten off.

TO JOIN

Join Motifs, turning each so the widest edge lines up with the narrowest edge on next Motif.

Join Glasgow in first unworked st after Row 6 on one Motif and through third ss from Round 5 on adjacent Motif. Ss together working through bl to beg of Row 6 on adjacent Motif.

Fasten off.

Repeat ss join so that all Motifs have been joined together.

Using Glasgow, ss in bl of sts across short edges of Scarf.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

HAIR TIE

These simple-to-make ringlets of yarn create a stunning waterfall effect in this hair tie designed by Emma Leith

■ Scheepjes Metropolis (75% wool, 25% nylon, 50g/200m), 1 ball of each: **Yarn A** Glasgow (002), **Yarn B** Manila (012), **Yarn C** Lahore (014), **Yarn D** Ulsan (015), **Yarn E** Dubai (047), **Yarn F** Bordeaux (058)

■ A 4mm (US G/6) hook

■ An elasticated hairband

TENSION

Tension is not critical, but it may affect the yarn quantities required

MEASUREMENTS

To fit any sized hairband

NOTES

Hair Tie is made up of 7 Swirls. Each Swirl is worked in rows throughout and attached to the hairband at the end.

Work with 2 strands of yarn held together as one throughout.

HAIR TIE

EXTRA-LONG SWIRL (MAKE 1)

Using Yarn E and F held together, ch53 leaving a 20cm tail.

Row 1 2tr in fourth ch from hook, 3tr in each ch to end.

Fasten off.

LONG SWIRL (MAKE 2)

Using Yarn A and B held together, ch43 leaving a 20cm tail.

Row 1 2tr in fourth ch from hook, 3tr in each ch to end.

Fasten off.

MEDIUM SWIRL (MAKE 2)

Using Yarn C and D held together, ch33 leaving a 20cm tail.

Row 1 2tr in fourth ch from hook, 3tr in each ch to end.

Fasten off.



SHORT SWIRL (MAKE 2)

Using Yarn E and F held together, ch23 leaving a 20cm tail.

Row 1 2tr in fourth ch from hook, 3tr in each ch to end.

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Using Yarn A and B held together, work 13dc around hairband.

Fasten off.

Join the Extra-Long Swirl to the centre st on the hairband. Join the Short Swirls to the first and last stitch on the hairband.

Leaving a 1 st gap between each Swirl, join the Long Swirls either side of the Extra-Long Swirl and the Medium Swirls between the Short and Long Swirls.

Weave in all ends.



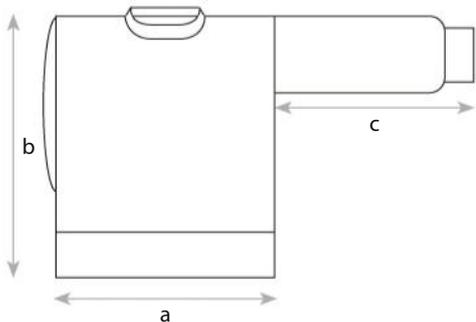

Cont to follow Sleeve Chart to end.

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

With WS facing, sew Front and Back together at shoulders.

Pin the top-centre of each Sleeve to shoulder seam, then pin the top edge of the Sleeve to the Front and Back. Once happy with the position, sew the tops of the Sleeves in place. Sew the Sleeve and side seams together. Weave in all ends.

NECK EDGING

With RS facing, join Yarn A in any st around neck opening.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, dc in each st and 2dc in each row-end around, ss to beg dc.

Work on in rows.

Row 2 Ch7, dc in second ch from hook and next 5 ch, ss in next 2 sts from Round 1, turn.

Row 3 Dc in bl of each st across, turn.

Row 4 Ch1, dc in bl of each st across, ss in next 2 sts from Round 1, turn.



Row 5 Ch1, dc to and including marked st, 10ss, turn leaving rem sts unworked. [30 sts]

Rows 6-7 Ch1, 10ss, turn. [10 sts]

Row 8 Ch1, 10htr, dc in marked st and each st to end, turn. [30 sts]

Row 9 Ch1, dc to and including marked st, 20ss, turn. [40 sts]

Row 10 Ch1, 20ss, dc to end, turn. [55 sts]

Row 11 Ch1, dc to and including marked st, 20ss, turn.

Row 12 Ch1, 10htr, 1ss, turn. [11 sts]

Row 13 Ch1, ss to end, turn. [26 sts]

Row 14 Ch1, ss to and including marked st, 22ss, turn. [27 sts]

Row 15 Ch1, ss to end, turn.

Row 16 Ch1, ss to and including marked st, 10htr, 1ss, turn. [16 sts]

Row 17 Ch1, 11ss, turn. [11 sts]

Row 18 Ch1, 12ss, turn. [12 sts]

Row 19 Ch1, ss to end, turn. [17 sts]

Row 20 Ch1, ss to and including marked st, 12htr, 1tr, 9htr, 1tr, 7htr, dc to end, turn. [55 sts]

Row 21 Ch1, dc to and including marked st, ss to end, turn.

Row 22 Ch1, ss to second marker, dc to end, turn.

Row 23 Ch1, dc to and including marked st, ss to end, turn.

Rep Rows 4-23 another 4 times, then rep Rows 4-20 once more.

Row 12 Ch1, 10htr, 1ss, turn. [11 sts]

Row 13 Ch1, 21ss, turn. [21 sts]

Rows 14-15 Ch1, 22ss, turn. [22 sts]

Row 16 As Row 12.

Row 17 Ch1, 21ss, dc to end, turn. [26 sts]

Row 18 Ch1, dc to and including marked st, 22ss, turn. [27 sts]

Row 19 Ch1, 22ss, dc to end, turn.

Row 20 Ch1, dc to and including marked st, 10htr, 1ss, turn. [16 sts]

Row 21 Ch1, 11 ss, turn. [11 sts]

Row 22 Ch1, 12ss, turn. [12 sts]

Row 23 Ch1, 12ss, dc to end, turn. [17 sts]

Row 24 Ch1, dc to and including marked st, 12htr, 1tr, 9htr, 1tr, 9htr, 1tr, 7htr, dc to end, turn. [50 sts]

Rows 25-27 As Row 2.

Rep Rows 4-27 another 7 times, then rep Rows 4-24 once more.

Fasten off.

Sew last row to foundation ch using whip stitch. Weave in all ends.

Round 2 (RS) Ch3, FPtr around next st, (tr in next st, FPtr around next st) rep around to end, ss to top of beg ch-3.

Rep Round 2 until rib measures 4cm.

STRIPED SECTION

Change to Off White.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3, tr in each st around, ss to top of beg ch-3.

Round 2 Ch3, tr in each st around, ss to top of beg ch-3.

Change to Red.

Rep Round 2, changing colour every 2 rounds in sequence set until Hat measure 16 (18: 20: 21: 23)cm long. Continue to follow stripes colour sequence to end of Hat.

SIZE 2Y ONLY

Next round Ch3, tr2tog, tr in next 51 sts, tr2tog, tr in final 50 sts, ss to top of beg ch-3. [104 (-: -: -) sts]

SIZE 3-5Y ONLY

Next round Ch3, (tr2tog, tr in next 16) 5 times, tr2tog, tr in final 17 sts, ss to top of beg ch-3. [- (104: -: -) sts]

SIZES 6-9Y AND 13-14Y ONLY

Next round Ch3, *tr2tog, tr in next - (-: 27: -: 29)

Move markers up as you work.

DECREASING PATTERN

Next round Ch3, tr in each st around, ss to top of beg ch-3.

Rep last round another 4 times more.

Next round Ch3, (tr2tog marked st and next st, move marker to dec, tr in each st to next

Round 1 (RS) Ch3, tr in each st around, ss to top of beg ch-3.

Round 2 (RS) Ch1, reverse dc in each st around, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off.

TO FINISH

Using DROPS Snow, make a pompom and sew to the top of the Hat.

Weave in all ends.

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO DECREASE IN TREBLE CROCHET (TR2TOG)



1 Begin working a treble as usual: yrh, insert hook under top 2 loops of next stitch on prev row, yrh, pull loop through (3 loops on hook), yrh and pull through first 2 loops (2 loops on hook).



2 Without finishing the first tr, begin the next tr, working yrh, insert hook in next stitch on prev row. Again, work yrh and pull loop through, yrh and pull through first 2 loops (3 loops on hook).



3 Now complete both the treble stitches together by working yrh and pull this loop through all 3 loops on hook.



4 This is how the completed tr2tog should look. You will have neatly decreased 1 tr stitch. On subsequent rows, you can simply work a stitch into the top of the tr2tog stitch as usual.

Hooking up eight colours of yarn makes one striking shawl! Using both tapestry and intarsia colourwork keeps things interesting.

NOTES

Shawl is worked from the point up. Use a mixture of tapestry and intarsia colourwork. For intarsia, wind off smaller balls of each colour use; this when the colour is used on one section only in that row. For tapestry, carry the unused colour across the top of your sts, enclosing the strand as you work. You can find full details on all colourwork techniques here: www.gathered.how/knitting-and-crochet/crochet/how-to-do-crochet-colourwork.

There is a Chart starting on page 124, which you will need to refer to when working the Shawl. Each square represents 1tr. Read all RS rows from right to left and WS rows from left to right. The first few rows of the Chart have been written out to guide you.

SHAWL

Using a 4mm hook and Charcoal, ch4.

Row 1 (RS) 2tr in fourth ch from hook, turn. [3 sts]

Row 2 (WS) Ch3, (counts as tr throughout), 2tr in next st, 1tr, turn. [4 sts]

Row 3 Ch3, 1tr, 2tr in the next st, 1tr, turn. [5 sts]

Row 4 Ch3, 2tr in next st, tr in each st to end, turn. [6 sts]

Row 5 Ch3, tr in each st to final 2 sts, 2tr in next st, tr in final st, turn. [7 sts]


Pattern is set by Rows 4-5.

Row 6 As Row 4. [8 sts]

Change to Mustard.

Row 7 Ch3, tr in next 4 sts, change to Teal, tr in each st to final 2 sts, 2tr in next st, tr in final st, turn. [9 sts]

Row 8 Ch3, 2tr in next st, tr to final 5 sts, change



The shawl is worked all in treble stitches, and finished with a double crochet and picot edging

to Mustard, tr in final 5 sts, turn. [10 sts]

Rows 9-150 Cont in patt set, using the Chart for all colour changes. [152 sts]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

EDGING

Using a 3mm hook, join Charcoal in first st across top.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), (dc, ch1, dc) in first st, dc in each st to final st, (dc, ch1, dc) in final st, 2dc in each row-end to base, (dc, ch1, dc) in corner, 2dc in each row end across next side, ss to beg dc.

Round 2 (RS) Ch1, dc in first st *ch-5 picot in corner ch-1 sp, (dc in next 3 sts, ch-3 picot) rep across to next ch-1 corner sp; rep from * around, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WORK TAPESTRY COLOURWORK



1 Work to the point where you want to change colour and on the last stitch in the first colour, work the final yrh using the second colour.



2 Work a stitch using the second colour, but hold the working end of the first colour on top of the stitches below and make sure you work the new stitch over the top of it, effectively encasing the first colour.



3 Continue working in this way, encasing the working end of the first colour. When you want to change colour again, use the same method as before: on the last stitch in the second colour, work the final yrh using the first colour.



4 It's important not to pull too tightly on the previous colour of yarn or it will pucker the fabric. Continue to work stitches using the first colour, over the top of the working end of the second colour.

Fasten off.

Turn to work across straight edge and join Yarn A in corner.

Next row (WS) Ch1, 108 (120: 132: 144: 156: 168) dc evenly across. turn.

Refer to the Chart for colour changes. Note beginning stitch position on Chart for your size.

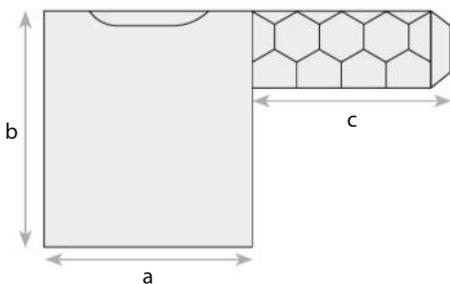

With RS facing, skip 42 (46: 46: 50: 54: 58) sts from Row 51 and join yarn in next st.

Row 1 (RS) Ch3, tr2tog, tr in each st to end, turn. [32 (36: 42: 46: 50: 54) sts]

Row 2 Ch3, tr to last 3 sts, tr2tog, tr in last st, turn. [31 (35: 41: 45: 49: 53) sts]

Rows 3-5 Ch3, tr in each st to end, turn.

Fasten off.

BACK

Work as for Front to **.

Rows 51-55 Ch3, tr in each st to end, turn.

Fasten off.

SLEEVES

FULL HEXAGON

Make 24 (24: 24: 18: 18: 18) using any colour.

Make 4 (4: 4: 2: 2: 2) using Yarn B on Rounds 1, 3 and 5 and Yarn A on Rounds 2 and 4.

Ch6, ss in last ch from hook to form a ring.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3, tr in ring, ch2, (2tr in ring, ch2) 5 times, ss to third ch of beg ch-3, turn. [12 sts, 5 ch-2 sps]

Round 2 (WS) Ch3, *(tr, ch2, tr) in ch-2 sp, tr in each tr to next ch-2 sp; rep from * around to end, ss to top of beg ch-3, turn. [24 sts, 5 ch-2 sps]

Rounds 3-5 Ch3, *tr in each st to ch-2 sp, (tr, ch1, tr) in ch-sp; rep from * around to end, ss to top of beg ch-3. [60 sts, 5 ch-2 sps]

Fasten off.

HALF VERTICAL HEXAGON

Make 2 in each of Yarns B and G.

Ch6, ss in last ch to form ring.

Row 1 (RS) Ch4 (counts as tr, ch1 throughout), (2tr in loop, ch2) twice, 2tr in loop, ch1, tr in loop, turn. [8 sts, 2 ch-2 sps, 2 ch-1 sps]

Rows 2-5 Ch4, tr in ch-1 sp, *tr in each tr to ch-2 sp, (tr, ch2, tr); rep from * to final ch-1 sp, (tr, ch1,

tr) in ch-sp, turn. [32 sts at end of Row 5]

Fasten off.

HALF HORIZONTAL HEXAGON

Make 0 (0: 0: 4: 4: 4) using Yarn B on Rounds 1, 3 and 5 and Yarn A on Rounds 2 and 4.

Make 0 (0: 0: 12: 12: 12) using any colour.

Ch6, ss in last ch to form ring.

Row 1 (RS) Ch3, tr in ring, ch2, (2tr in ring, ch2) twice, 2tr in ring, turn. [8 sts, 3 ch-2 sps]

Rows 2-5 Ch3, *tr in each tr to ch-2 sp, (tr, ch2, tr) in ch-2 sp; rep from * twice more tr in each tr to end, turn. [32 sts at end of Row 5]

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP SLEEVES

SIZES S, M AND L ONLY

Sew 4 Hexagons into a strip. Make a second strip in the same way.

Sew 3 Hexagons into a strip, then sew a Half Vertical Hexagon onto each end. Make a second strip in the same way.

Sew the 4 complete strips together (the Half Vertical Hexagon edges make up the upper arm and Cuff edges).

SIZES XL, 2X AND 3X ONLY

Sew 4 Hexagons into a strip.

Sew 3 Hexagons into a strip, then sew a Half Vertical Hexagon onto each end. Make a second strip in the same way. Sew these 2 strips either side of the 4 Hexagon strip.

Sew 4 Half Horizontal Hexagons across each zigzag edge of joined motifs, matching colours on opposite edge.

With RS facing, join Yarn A to work across Half Horizontal Hexagon edge.

Row 1 (RS) Ch3, tr in each st/ch-sp and 2tr in each row-end across, turn.

Row 2 (WS) Ch3, tr in each st to end.

Fasten off.

Rep Rows 1-2 on opposite Half Horizontal Hexagon edge.

CUFFS

Using Yarn B, ch16.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch to end, turn. [15 dc]

Row 2 Ch1, dc in bl of each st across, turn. Rep Row 2 another 30 (30: 30: 38: 38: 38) times. Work next row across long edge of Cuff.

Next row Ch1, dc in each row-end across, turn. [32 (32: 32: 40: 40: 40) sts]

Next row Ch3, tr in st at base of ch-3, 2tr in each st across, turn. [64 (64: 64: 80: 80: 80) sts]

Next row Ch3, tr in each st across, turn.

Rep last row once more.

Fasten off leaving a long tail.

TO MAKE UP

Sew Front and Back together at shoulders.

Sew the top of the Sleeve to the Body, then sew the Sleeve and side seams closed.



On two-colour rows, carry yarns across the top of the stitches, enclosing them as you work

Sew edges of Cuff together, then sew the final tr row of Cuff to the base of the Sleeve.

NECKBAND

With RS facing, join Yarn B at shoulder seam.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, dc in each st and 2dc in each row-end around neck, ss to beg dc. Neckband continues in rows.

Row 1 Ch7, dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch to end, ss in next 2 sts from Round 1, turn.

Row 2 Dc in bl of next 6 dc from last row, turn.

Row 3 Ch1, dc in bl of next 6 dc, ss in next 2 sts of Round 1, turn.

Rep Rows 2-3 until all sts of Round 1 have been worked into.

Fasten off.

TO FINISH

Sew the final row of Neckband to the base of Row 1.

Weave in all ends.

Change to a 6.5mm hook and Yarn B.

Row 1 (RS) Ch3 (counts as tr throughout), tr in each st to end, turn.

Row 2 (WS) Ch3, (2tr, ch2, skip 2 sts) rep to last 3 sts, 3tr, turn.

Change to Yarn C.

Row 3 Ch3, (2tr, 2dtr into 2 sts skipped 2 rows below) to last 3 sts, 3tr, turn.



Row 15 Ch3, patt2tog, patt to end, turn.

[30 (34: 38: 42 46) sts]

Row 16 Ch3, patt to last 3 sts, patt2tog, tr in final st, turn. [29 (33: 37: 41 45) sts]

Rep last 2 rows another 3 (4: 5: 6: 7) times, then rep Row 15 once more. [22 (24: 26: 28: 30) sts]

Next row Work in patt without decreasing.

Rep last row twice more.

Next row Ch3, tr in each st to end.

Fasten off.

SLEEVES (MAKE 2)

RIB

Using a 6mm hook and Yarn A, ch30 (34: 38: 42: 46).

Row 1 (WS) Tr in third ch from hook, tr in each

ch to end, turn. [29 (33: 37: 41: 45) sts]

Row 2 (RS) Ch2, BPtr around next st, (FPtr around next st, BPtr around next st) rep to last st, htr in last st, turn.

Row 3 Ch2, FPtr around next st, (BPtr around next st, FPtr around next st) to last st, htr in last st, turn.

Row 4 As Row 2.

Row 5 Ch1, dc in each st to end, turn.

CHECK PATTERN

Change to a 6.5mm hook and Yarn B.

Row 6 Ch3, 2tr in each st to last st, tr in last st, turn. [56 (64: 72: 80: 88) sts]

Rows 7-29 Work in patt and colour sequence as Rows 2-12 of Body.

Using Yarn A.

Row 30 Ch3, tr in each st to end.

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Work all joining with a whipstitch seam and WS facing.

Fold Sleeves in half and match centre of final row to shoulder seam. Sew Sleeves into armhole.

Sew sleeve seams.

FRONT EDGING

With RS facing and using a 6mm hook, join Yarn A in bottom row of Right Front to work around opening.

Row 1 (RS) Ch3, 4tr across Rib, 2tr in each row-end up to shoulder seam, tr in shoulder seam, tr in each st from Back, tr in shoulder seam, 2tr in each row-end of Left Front, 5tr in Rib end, turn.

Row 2 (WS) Ch2, (BPtr around next st, FPtr around next st) rep to last st, htr in last st, turn.

Place 3 markers on Left Front where you want the buttonholes to be positioned. The first button should be in line with Row 1 of Check Pattern, the second with Row 6 and the third



Create the ribbing of the front edging by working front and back post treble stitches

with Row 11.

Row 3 Ch2, *(BPtr around next BP st, FPtr around next FP st) rep to next marker, ch2, skip marked st and next st; rep from * to end, turn.

Row 4 Ch2, *(BPtr around next BP st, FPtr around next FP st) rep to ch-2 sp, 2tr in ch-sp; rep from * to end.

Fasten off.

TO FINISH

Sew the buttons to the front right, in line with the buttonholes on the front left.

Weave in all ends and block to measurements.


SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO SEW SEAMS



1 Sewing with a tapestry needle is the regular and neat way to join seams. Place pieces of crochet WS together and oversew them as above, using a tapestry needle.



2 To slip stitch a seam, place the crochet pieces RS together. *Insert hook through both edge stitches, yrh, pull through to complete 1 slip stitch; rep from *, keeping the work fairly loose.



3 For a dc seam, place the crochet pieces RS together, or WS together for a visible seam. Work as for slip stitch seam, using double crochet instead of slip stitch.



4 A useful variation on the dc seam, the dc and chain seam is used when you need less bulk and/or greater flexibility in the seam. Work as for the dc seam, but work 1 dc and 1 chain alternately.



Round 4 Ch2, tr in next st (counts as tr2tog), (ch2, tr2tog next 2 sts) 17 times, ch2, ss to top of beg tr2tog. [18 sts, 18 ch-2 sps]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn B in any ch-2 sp.

Round 5 Ch3, 2tr in same ch-sp, ch1, (3tr, ch1) in each ch-2 sp around, ss to top of beg ch-3. [54 sts, 18 ch-1 sps]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn C in any ch-1 sp.

Round 5 Ch3, 2tr in same sp, *skip 1 st, tr in next st, skip 1 st, 3tr in ch-1 sp; rep from * 16 times more, skip 1 st, tr in next st, skip 1 st, ss to top of beg ch-3. [72 sts]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn D in any st.

Rounds 6-7 Ch3, tr in each st around, ss to top of beg ch-3.

Round 8 Ch1 (counts as dc), (dc2tog, dc in next 4 sts) 11 times, dc2tog, dc in final 3 sts, ss to beg ch-1. [60 sts]

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

BACK

Rounds 1-3 As Rounds 1-3 of Front.

Round 4 Ch3, tr in st at base of ch-3, (tr in next 2 sts, 2tr in next st) 11 times, tr in next 2 sts, ss to top of beg ch-3. [48 sts]

Round 5 Ch3, tr in st at base of ch-3, (tr in next 3 sts, 2tr in next st) 11 times, tr in next 3 sts, ss to top of beg ch-3. [60 sts]

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

HEADBAND COVER

Using Yarn A, make a ch to the length of the







Round 3 Ch1, (dc, picot, dc) in each qtr around, ss to beg dc. [48 sts]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn A in in any ch-sp of Round 2.

Round 4 Ch2, tr in the same ch-sp (counts as 2-tr cl), ch3, skip picot, *2-tr cl in the next ch-sp, ch3, skip picot; rep from * 22 times more, ss to beg ch2, turn. [24 sts, 24 ch-3 sps]

Round 5 Ch4 (counts as dtr), (2dtr, ch3, 3dtr) in the same ch-sp, *(ch1, skip cl, 3tr in next ch-sp) 5 times, ch1, (3dtr, ch3, 3dtr) in the next ch-sp; rep from * around to end, ss to top of beg ch-4. [84 sts, 4 ch-3 sps, 24 ch-1 sps]

Fasten off.

Work Round 6 on the first Square only. Work the JAYG round on all rem Squares.

Join Yarn B in sp between first and second dtr.

sts on current Square, ch1, ss in next ch-3 sp on adjacent Square, ch1; rep from * across to next corner, ch2, ss in ch-4 corner sp on adjacent Square; rep from * if joining across second side, ch2, **dc in sp between next 2 dtr, ch3, dc in sp between next 2 sts, (ch3, dc between next 2 tr) rep across to next corner, ch4, skip ch-3 sp; rep from ** around to end, ss to beg dc.

Using Yarn B, ch4 and ss in last ch from hook to form a loop.

Row 1 (RS) Ch1, 7dc in the loop, turn. [7 sts]

Row 2 Ch7 (counts as qtr, ch1), qtr in the same st, ch1, (qtr, ch1, qtr, ch1) in next 5 sts, (qtr, ch1, qtr) in final st, turn. [14 sts, 13 ch-1 sps]

Row 3 Ch1, *picot in qtr, dc in the ch-sp; rep from * 12 times more, picot in final st, turn. [27 sts]

Join Yarn A in qtr from Round 2.

Row 4 Ch2, tr in same st (counts as 2-tr cl), *ch3, skip picot, 2-tr cl in the next ch-space; rep from * to final st, turn. [14 cl, 13 ch-3 sps]

Row 5 Ch3 (counts as tr), *3tr in the first ch-sp, ch1; rep from * 5 times more, (3dtr, ch3, 3dtr) in the next ch-sp, ch1, **3tr in the next ch-sp, ch1*; rep from ** 5 times more, tr in the last st, turn. [58 sts]

Change to Yarn B.

JAYG row Ch3, *dc between the first and second tr, ch3, dc between the second and third tr, ch3; rep from * to next dtr, dc between the first and second dtr, ch3, dc between second and third dtr, ch2, ss in ch-4 sp on adjacent Square, ch2, (dc in sp between next 2 sts on Half Motif, ch1, ss in ch-3 sp on adjacent Square, ch1) rep across to final st, ch1, ss in corner on adjacent Square, ch1, ss in final st.

Fasten off.

CENTRAL HALF MOTIFS (MAKE 5)

Work Rows 1-5 of First Half Motif.

Change to Yarn B.

JAYG row Ch1, ss in corner on adjacent Square, ch1, *(dc in sp between next 2 sts, ch1, ss in next ch-3 sp on adjacent Square, ch1)** rep across to ch-3 sp, ch2, ss in corner on adjacent Square, ch2, rep from * to ** to final st, ch1, ss in corner on adjacent Square, ch1, ss in final st.

Fasten off.

FINAL HALF MOTIF

Work Rows 1-5 of First Half Motif.

Change to Yarn B.

JAYG row Ch1, ss in corner on adjacent Square, ch1, (dc in sp between next 2 sts, ch1, ss in next ch-3 sp on adjacent Square, ch1) rep across to ch-3 sp, ch2, ss in corner on adjacent Square, ch2, (dc in sp between next 2 sts, ch3) rep across to final st, ss in final st.

Fasten off.

BORDER

Join Yarn B in any ch-3.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3, 2tr in same sp, ch1, *(3tr, ch1) in each ch-sp to corner, (3tr, ch3, 3tr, ch1) in corner; rep from * around to end, ss to beg tr, turn.

Fasten off.

Join Yarn A in any ch-1 sp.

Round 2 (WS) Ch3, 2tr in same sp, ch1, *(3tr, ch1) in each ch-sp to corner, (3tr, ch3, 3tr, ch1) in corner; rep from * around to end, ss to beg tr, turn.

Round 3 Using Yarn B, rep Round 2.

Round 4 Ch1, *(dc in each tr to ch-1 sp, picot, skip ch-sp) rep across to corner, (dc, picot, dc) in corner; rep from * around to end, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off.



SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WORK A CLUSTER STITCH (3-TR CLUSTER)



1 Start a treble in the usual way: yrh, insert hook, yrh, pull loop through (3 loops on hook), yrh, pull through first 2 loops (2 loops on hook). Stop here, without finishing.



2 Start treble in the same st/sp: yrh, insert hook in the same st/sp again, yrh, pull loop through (4 loops on hook), yrh and pull through first 2 loops (3 loops on hook). Stop here.



3 Repeat step 2 until you've worked the number of trebles shown in pattern; in this example we're working 3-tr cl. Next finish all trebles together: yrh, pull loop through all loops on hook.



4 This is how the completed cluster should look. On the next row, just work a stitch into the top of the cluster as usual. The stitch count should remain the same.

What's better than a crochet blanket?

A belter of a graphic blanket from mosaic crochet supreme Esme Crick, that's what

- Yarn And Colors Must-Have (100% cotton; 50g/125m), 10 balls of **Yarn A** Black (100), 8 balls of **Yarn B** White (001)
- Yarn And Colors Glamour (100% polyester; 20g/158m), 5 balls of **Yarn C** Gold (089)
- A 4mm (US G/6) hook
- Cardboard, 12cm long

TENSION

Tension is not critical, but it may affect the yarn quantities required

MEASUREMENTS

Blanket measures approx 90x117cm (35½x46in) excluding tassels

ABBREVIATIONS

mtr Tr in skipped st 3 rows below, working in front of the ch-sps of the previous 2 rows.

For a full list, see page 130

NOTES

Parts of this pattern are worked using the mosaic method. Instead of changing colour mid-row, you will skip sts and work a ch-sp where a different colour is required. Then on the next row that uses that colour you will work mosaic sts into the skipped sts, working in front of the ch-sps of the previous rows. You can find tutorials on this technique here: www.gathered.how/knitting-and-crochet/crochet/how-to-mosaic-crochet There is a Chart on page 122, which you will need to refer to when working the mosaic

sections. Read each row twice, once from right to left for the RS row and once from left to right for the WS row. Change colour at the end of WS row. If a second colour appears on the row, you will need to skip the number of sts shown in that colour and work a ch for each skipped st plus 1. For example, if you skip 2 sts you will make a ch3. On the next row using that colour you will work an mtr into each skipped st. The first few rows of the Chart have been written out to guide you.

On the mosaic sections, rather than fastening off, carry the unused strands up the side of your work ready to use again when directed. You can work over the carried strands when making the Border.

MOSAIC BLANKET

Using Yarn A, ch171.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in bl of second ch from hook, dc in bl of each ch to end, turn. [170 sts]

Rows 2-4 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), dc in each st to end, turn.

Change to Yarn B.

When working from the Chart, work sts 1-72, then work the rep section twice before working the final 2 sts.

Row 5 (RS) Ch1, 1dc, ch2, skip 1 st, 4dc, *ch3, skip 2 sts, 4dc; rep from * to last 2 sts, ch2, skip 1 st, 1dc, turn.

Row 6 Ch1, 1dc, ch2, skip ch-2 sp, 4dc, *ch3, skip ch-3 sp, 4dc; rep from * to last ch-2 sp, ch2, skip ch-2 sp, 1dc, turn.

Change to Yarn A.

Row 7 Ch1, 1dc, 1mtr, (2dc, ch3, skip 2 sts, 2mtr) twice, ch3, skip 2 sts, 2dc, 2mtr, ch3, skip 2 sts, 2dc, *(2mtr, 2dc, ch3, skip 2 sts) twice, (2mtr, ch3, skip 2 sts, 2dc) twice; rep from * to last 2 sts, 1mtr, 1dc, turn.

Row 8 Ch1, (dc in each dc and mtr to ch-sp, ch3, skip ch-sp) rep across to end, turn.

Change to Yarn B.

Row 9 Ch1, 1dc, ch4, skip 3 sts, 2mtr, 2dc, ch3, skip 2 sts, 2mtr, 2dc, 2mtr, ch3, skip 2 sts, 2dc, 2mtr, *ch3, skip 2 sts, 2dc, (ch3, skip 2 sts, 2mtr, 2dc) twice, 2mtr, ch3, skip 2 sts, 2dc, 2mtr; rep from * to last 4 sts, ch4, skip 3 sts, 1dc, turn.

Rows 10-36 Cont in patt set, using the Chart as you work.

Cont with Yarn A.

Rows 37-38 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Change to Yarn B.

Rows 39-238 As Row 37, changing colour every 4 rows between Yarn A and Yarn B.

Rows 239-272 Rep Rows 5-38.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

BORDER

Work with 2 strands of Yarn C held together as one throughout.

With RS facing, join Yarn C in first st in the top right-hand corner.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 1dc in each st to last st on

top, (1dc, ch2, 1dc) in last st (corner made), rotate work 90 degrees, (1dc in next 3 row-ends, skip next row-end) rep to end of long side, (1dc, ch2, 1dc) in first st on bottom edge, 1dc in each st to last st on bottom edge, (1dc, ch2, 1dc) in last st, rotate work 90 degrees, (1dc in next 3 row ends, skip next row end) rep to end of long side, (1dc, ch2) in same st as first dc, ss to first dc, turn.

Round 2 (WS) Ch1, *(1dc, ch2, 1dc) in ch-2 sp, 1dc in each st to next ch-2 sp; rep from * around to end, ss to first dc.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

TASSELS (MAKE 16)

Using Yarn C, wrap yarn 100 times around a piece of card approx 12cm in length. Insert a 30cm length of Yarn C under all loops at top, knot securely in middle to fasten. Cut through all loops along bottom edge to remove from cardboard. Wrap a 30cm piece of yarn around top of tassel, approx 3cm from top. Attach 8 Tassels evenly across each short edge. Trim Tassel to desired length.

IMPALA WALL ART HEAD

No luxe cottage setting is complete without some decorative wall art. Hook up Vanessa Moonicie's impala, her latest masterpiece

- Yarn and Colors Must-Have 4ply (100% cotton, 50g/125m), 2 balls of **Yarn A** Black (100), 1 ball of **Yarn B** White (001)
- Yarn and Colors Glamour (100% polyester, 20g/158m), 1 ball of **Yarn C** Gold (089)
- A 2mm (US B/1) hook
- A 2.5mm (US C/2) hook
- Toy stuffing
- Circle mountboard, circle measuring 8.5cm (3¼in) in diameter for the base
- 2 mountboard pieces, each measuring 2.5x8cm for the ears, with one short end cut to form a pointed arch shape
- 2 lengths of craft wire, 2mm (12-gauge) and 33cm long (available at www.the-beadshop.co.uk)
- A brass curtain or roman blind ring, 2cm
- Long-nose pliers

TENSION

23 sts and 26 rows measure 10 x10cm (4x4in) over checked pattern using a 2.5mm hook, or size needed to obtain correct tension

MEASUREMENTS

Impala measures approx 20cm (7¾in) tall (excluding horns) and 19cm (7½in) snout to back of head

NOTES

Parts of this pattern are worked using the amigurumi method. Work stitches

MERRY MONOCHROME

continuously in a spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as you work.

Change colour on the final yrh of st before colour change is indicated. Carry the unused colour across the WS of your work.

IMPALA SNOUT

Using a 2.5mm hook and Yarn A, ch5.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in next 3 ch, turn. [4 sts]

Row 2 (WS) Ch1, dc in each st to end, turn.

Rows 3-4 As Row 2.

Row 5 Ch1, dc in next st, join Yarn B in last st, dc in same dc as last st, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn B, (dc with Yarn B, dc with Yarn A, dc with Yarn B) in next st, rotate piece and dc in edge of next 2 rows with Yarn B; working into opposite side of each ch, (dc with Yarn B, dc with Yarn A, dc with Yarn B) in next st, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn B, (dc with Yarn B, dc with Yarn A, dc with Yarn B) in next st, rotate piece and work 1 dc in edge of next 2 rows with Yarn B, dc in same st as first dc, ss to first dc, turn. [20 sts]

Row 6 (Dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, 2 dc in next st with Yarn A) 4 times, turn. [24 sts]

Row 7 Ch1, (dc in next st, 2dc in next st with Yarn A, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn. [28 sts]

Row 8 (Dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, turn.

Row 9 Ch1, (dc in next 3 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn.

Row 10 (Dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, turn.

Rows 11-12 As Rows 9-10.

Row 13 Ch1, (dc in next st, 2dc in next st, dc in next st with Yarn A, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn. [32 sts]

Row 14 (Dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, turn.

Row 15 Ch1, (dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn.

Row 16 As Row 14.

Row 17 Ch1, (2dc in next st, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn. [36 sts]

Row 18 (Dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, turn.

Row 19 Ch1, (dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, 2dc in next st) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn. [40 sts]

Row 20 (Dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, turn.

Row 21 Ch1, (dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn. [44 sts]

Row 22 (Dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, turn.

Row 23 Ch1, (dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in

next 2 sts with Yarn B, 2dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn. [48 sts]

Row 24 (Dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, turn.

Row 25 Ch1, (2dc in next st, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn. [52 sts]

Row 26 (Dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, turn.

Row 27 Ch1, (dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, 2dc in next st) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn. [56 sts]

Row 28 (Dc in next 7 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, turn.

Row 29 Ch1, (dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B, in next 7 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, ss to first dc, turn.

Rows 30-31 As Rows 28-29.

Row 32 As Row 28.

SHAPE SIDES OF HEAD

Row 33 *Ch1, (dc in next 7 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B) 3 times, dc in next 7 sts with Yarn A, turn*, leaving the last 7 sts unworked.

Continue on the 49 sts just worked.

Rows 34-38 Rep from * to * of Row 33.

Row 39 Ch1, (dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog) 3 times, dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B, turn. [46 sts]

Row 40 Ch1, (dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) 3 times, dc in next 7 sts with Yarn B, turn.

Row 41 Ch1, (dc2tog, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) 3 times, dc2tog with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts, turn. [42 sts]

Rows 42-44 Ch1, (dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) 3 times, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, turn.

SHAPE BACK OF HEAD

Row 45 Ch1, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, *dc2tog, dc in next 2 sts, dc2tog* with Yarn A; rep from * to * with Yarn B;

rep from * to * with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, turn. [36 sts]

Row 46 Ch1, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, turn.

Row 47 Ch1, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog with Yarn A, dc in next 2 sts, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, turn. [34 sts]

Row 48 Ch1, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, turn.

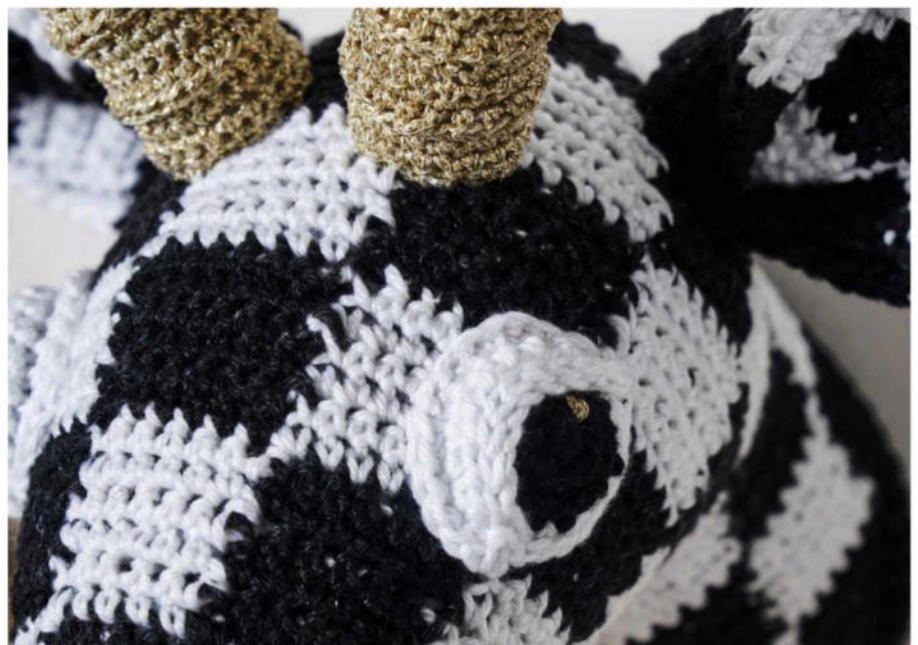
Row 49 Ch1, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next st with Yarn A, dc2tog, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog with Yarn A, dc in next st, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, turn. [32 sts]

Row 50 Ch1, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog with Yarn A, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, turn. [30 sts]

Row 51 Ch1, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, skip next st, ss in next st, turn, leaving the last 17 sts unworked.

Row 52 Dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, turn.

Row 53 Ch1, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, skip next unworked st, ss



MERRY MONOCHROME

in next st, turn.

Rows 54-55 As Rows 52-53.

Row 56 As Row 52.

Do not fasten off.

NECK

With RS facing, skip next 12 sts of last row, skip next 11 unworked sts, ss in next dc with Yarn B to join the corners.

Row 1 (RS) Ch1, rotate Head and, starting in same st as ss, *dc in edge of next 6 Rows with Yarn B, dc in edge of next 6 Rows with Yarn A*, dc in edge of next 6 Rows with Yarn B, dc in next 5 unworked sts of Row 32 of Head with Yarn A, dc2tog; rotate Head and rep from * to * twice, ss to first dc, turn. [48 sts]

Row 2 (WS) (Dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B) 4 times, turn.

Row 3 Ch1, (dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) 4 times, ss in next st, turn.

Rows 4-5 As Rows 2-3.

Row 6 As Row 2.

Row 7 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, (dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) twice, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn, leaving the last 6 sts unworked. [40 sts]
Cont on 40 sts.

Row 8 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, (dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) twice, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [38 sts]

Row 9 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A,

(dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) twice, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [36 sts]

Row 10 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next st with Yarn A, (dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) twice, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next st with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [34 sts]

Row 11 Ch1, dc2tog with Yarn A, (dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A) twice, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog with Yarn A, turn. [32 sts]

Row 12 Ch1, dc2tog with Yarn B, dc in next 5 sts, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog, turn. [30 sts]

Row 13 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [28 sts]

Row 17 Ch1, dc2tog with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog with Yarn A, turn. [20 sts]

Row 18 Ch1, dc2tog with Yarn B, dc in next 5 sts, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog, turn. [18 sts]

Row 19 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [16 sts]

Row 20 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [14 sts]

Row 21 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [12 sts]

Row 22 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next st with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next st with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [10 sts]

Row 23 Ch1, dc2tog with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog with Yarn A, turn. [8 sts]

Row 24 Ch1, dc2tog with Yarn B, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog with Yarn B, turn. [6 sts]

Do not fasten off.

NECK EDGING

Row 1 (RS) Change Yarn A, ch1, *dc in next 6 sts, dc in edge of next 18 Rows, dc in next 6 sts*; rep from * to *. [48 sts]

Fasten off.

Sew together the opening at the back of the

Head. Stuff the Head and Neck firmly.

BASE (MAKE 2)

Using 2.5mm hook and Yarn A, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 sts]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [12 sts]

Round 3 (2dc in next st, 1dc) 6 times. [18 sts]

Round 4 (1dc, 2dc in next st, 1dc) 6 times. [24 sts]

Rounds 5-8 Cont increasing by 6 sts on each round as set. [48 sts]

Rounds 9-11 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off first piece only.

JOIN BASE PIECES

Place the 2 Base pieces with WS together.

Dc in next 30 dc of both pieces to join, insert circle mount board between the pieces, dc rem 18 dc to close.

Do not fasten off.

JOIN BASE TO NECK

With the Base facing, dc into each of the 48 sts of the Base and the Neck Edging at the same time to join, inserting more stuffing into the Neck before closing.

Ss to next st and fasten off.

EARS (MAKE 2)

INNER EAR

Using a 2.5mm hook and Yarn A, ch16.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, change to Yarn B, dc in next 5 ch, dc in next 5 ch with Yarn A, turn. [15 sts]

Row 2 (WS) Ch1, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, turn.

Rows 3-6 As Row 2.

Rows 7-10 Ch1, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, turn.

Row 11 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog, turn. [13 sts]

Row 12 Ch1, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 4 sts with Yarn B, turn.

Row 13 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [11 sts]

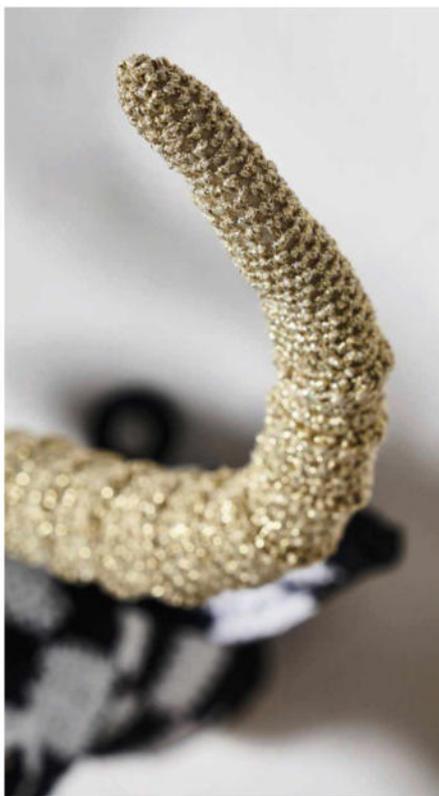
Row 14 Ch1, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 3 sts with Yarn A, turn.

Row 15 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next st with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next st with Yarn A, dc2tog, turn. [9 sts]

Row 16 Ch1, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 2 sts with Yarn A, turn.

Row 17 Ch1, dc2tog with Yarn A, dc in next 5 sts with Yarn B, dc2tog with Yarn A, turn. [7 sts]

Row 18 Ch1, dc in next st with Yarn A, dc in next



MERRY MONOCHROME

5 sts with Yarn B, dc in next st with Yarn A, turn. Continue with Yarn A.

Row 19 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in each st to last 2 sts, dc2tog, turn. [5 sts]

Row 20 Ch1, dc in each st to end.

Row 21 As Row 19. [3 sts]

Row 22 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in next st. [2 sts]

Fasten off.

EAR EDGING

With RS of Ear facing, join Yarn A with a ss to the edge of the first row.

Row 1 Ch1, dc in next 6 rows with Yarn A, dc in next 6 Rows with Yarn B, (dc in next 9 Rows, 2dc in next 2 sts of Row 21, dc in next 9 Rows) with Yarn A, dc in next 6 Rows with Yarn B, dc in next 6 Rows with Yarn A. [46 sts]

Fasten off.

OUTER EAR

Work as for Inner Ear.

Do not fasten off after completing the Ear Edging.

JOIN EAR PIECES

Place WS of an Inner and an Outer Ear together.

Row 1 Ch1, working into each stitch of both pieces at the same time to join, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, (dc in next 10 sts, 2dc in next 2 sts, dc in next 10 sts) with Yarn A, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn B, dc in next 6 sts with Yarn A, ss to first dc to join the corners. [48 sts]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail of Yarn A at the end.

EYES (MAKE 2)

EYEBALL

Using a 2.5mm hook and Yarn A, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 5dc into loop. [5 sts]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [10 sts]

Round 3 (2dc in next st, 1dc) 5 times. [15 sts]

Change to Yarn B.

EYE SOCKET

Round 4 (Working in bl only) (2dc in next st, 2dc) 5 times. [20 sts]

Round 5 (Working in bl only) (2dc in next st, 2dc) 3 times, 2dc in next st, ss in next 10 dc. [24 sts]

Do not fasten off.

EYELID

The following is worked in Rows.

Row 1 Ch1, working in the unworked fl of the next 10 dc of Round 4, dc in next st, htr in next 8 sts, dc in next st (these 10 sts form the upper lid), ch1, ss in the first ss of the previous round, turn.

Row 2 Ch1, ss in each of the 10 sts of the eyelid, ch1, ss in the first dc of Round 5, behind the Eyelid.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail of Yarn B.

HORNS (MAKE 2)

Using a 2mm hook and Yarn C, make a magic loop.

Round 1 Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 sts]

Round 2 Dc in each st around.

Round 3 (2dc in next st, 1dc) 3 times. [9 sts]

Rounds 4-10 Dc in each st around.

Round 11 (2dc in next st, 2dc) 3 times. [12 sts]

Rounds 12-20 Dc in each st around.

Round 21 (2dc in next st, 3dc) 3 times. [15 sts]

Rounds 22-26 Dc in each st around. Turn at the end of Row 26.

Cont in rows.

Row 1 (WS) Ch2, htr in bl only of each st to end, turn.

Row 2 (RS) Ch1, dc in unworked loop of each st to end, turn.

Rows 3-6 Ch1, dc in each st to end, turn.

Rows 7-12 As Rows 1-6.

Rows 13-17 As Rows 1-5.

Row 18 Ch1, (2dc in next st, 4dc) 3 times, turn. [18 sts]

Rows 19-24 As Rows 1-6.

Rows 25-29 As Rows 1-5.

Row 30 Ch1, (2dc in next st, 5dc) 3 times, turn. [21 sts]

Rows 31-90 Rep Rows 1-6 another 10 times.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail of yarn.

HANGING LOOP

Using a 2.5mm hook and Yarn A, work 25 dc around brass ring, ss to the first dc.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Sew the lower edge of the ring securely to the top of the Base.

TO MAKE UP

Sew all around the outer edges of the Eyes, inserting a small amount of stuffing into the Eyeball before closing the opening. Using Yarn C, embroider a highlight in each Eye.

Insert the pointed end of each strip of board into the tip of the Ears. Sew together the open edges. Sew together the corners to shape the Ears. Sew the Ears to the Head.

Use the pliers to bend and pinch together 1cm at one sharp end on each length of wire to prevent them poking through the Horns. Push a small amount of stuffing into the tip of the Horn. Thread the folded end of the wire through the opening at the base of the Horn, into the stuffed tip. Add stuffing around the wire at the top of the Horn. Working in stages, starting at the lower end of the Horn, wrap a section of the wire with stuffing and use the tail of yarn to sew together the open edges to encase the wrapped wire. Poke the sharp ends of the excess wire into the Head, where the Horns are to be attached.

With the seam facing the back of the Head, sew the Horns in place, stitching all around the edges. Bend the Horns to shape.

Weave in all rem ends.

MEASUREMENTS

Each Flag measures approx 11cm (4¼in) wide

ABBREVIATIONS

picot Ch3, ss in last ch from hook

NOTES

Flags are worked in rounds with RS facing throughout.

Parts of this pattern are worked using the amigurumi method. Work stitches continuously in a spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as you work.

FLAGS (MAKE 10)

Use Gold for Rounds 1-4 on all Flags. Then make 5 each in Black and White for Rounds 5-12.

Using a 2.5mm hook and Gold, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st), 6dc in loop. [6 sts]

Round 2 (RS) 2dc in each st around. [12 sts]

Round 3 (1dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [18 sts]

Round 4 *(1dc, 1htr) in next st, (1tr, 1dtr, picot, 1tr) in next st, (1htr, 1dc) in next st; rep from * 5 times more, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off.

Join next colour in last dc from Round 4.

Round 5 Ch1, (dc in next 2 dc, ch3, skip 5 sts) 6 times. [12 dc and 6 ch-3-sps]

Position ch-sps behind sts from Round 4.

Round 6 (2dc, 4dc in ch-3 sp) 6 times. [36 sts]

Round 7 (5dc, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [42 sts]

Round 8 (7dc, 1dc in picot from Round 4) 6 times. [48 sts]

Round 9 (4dc, 2htr, 2tr, ch2, 2tr, 2tr, 4dc) 3 times. [48 sts, 3 ch-2-sp]

Round 10 *4dc, 2htr, 2tr, (1tr, ch2, 1tr) in ch-2 sp, 2tr, 2htr, 4dc; rep from * twice more. [54 and 3 ch-2-sp sts]

Round 11 *4dc, 2htr, 3tr, (1tr, ch2, 1tr) in ch-2 sp, 3tr, 2htr, 4dc; rep from * twice more. [60 and 3 ch-2-sp sts]

Round 12 *6htr, 4tr, (1tr, ch3, 1tr) in ch-2 sp, 4tr, 6hr; rep from * twice more. [66 and 3 ch-3-sp sts]

Fasten off.

Next row works across two sides of the Flag.

Using a 3mm hook, join Gold in any ch-3 sp.

Row 13 Ch1, 2dc in ch-sp, dc in next 22 sts, (2dc, ch2, 2dc) in ch-sp, dc in next 22 sts, 2dc in corner.

Fasten off.

Block the Flags.



TO MAKE UP

Flags are joined together across the unworked edges. Work with RS facing.

Use a 3mm hook and Gold.

Row 1 (RS) Ch40, *2dc in first ch-sp across top edge, dc in next 22 sts, 2dc in next ch-sp, ch28; rep from * for each Flag, ch41, turn.

Row 2 Ss in second ch from hook, ss in each ch/st across.

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Attach a finding to the bottom corner of each Flag. Attach a tassel to each finding and trim if desired.

■ A 3mm (US C/2 or D/3) hook

■ A 2mm (US B/1) hook

■ A cushion pad, 30x30cm

■ A chalk pen (optional)

TENSION

15 sts and 19 rows measure 10x10cm (4x4in) over double crochet using a 4mm hook, or size needed to obtain correct tension

MEASUREMENTS

Cushion measures approx 30x30cm (11¾x11¾in)

ABBREVIATIONS

reverse dc Insert hook in next st to right (or left if left-handed), yrh and pull up a loop, yrh and pull through 2 loops on hook

surface crochet Position yarn on WS, insert hook from RS to WS, yrh and pull up a loop, pull through loop on hook, *insert hook back through to WS in direction you want the surface crochet to travel, yrh and pull up a loop, pull through loop on hook; rep from * as required

ch4 picot Ch4, ss to 4th ch

ch6 picot Ch6, ss to 6th ch

ch7 picot Ch7, ss to 7th ch

NOTES

Cushion is made up of 2 identical Panels. Each Panel is worked in rows and edged with Gold. One Panel is embellished with surface crochet and a Star motif.

CUSHION

PANEL (MAKE 2)

Using a 4mm hook and Yarn A, ch45.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch to end, turn. [44 sts]

Rows 2-28 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), dc in each st across, turn.

Change to Yarn B.

Rows 29-56 As Row 2.

EDGING

Join Yarn C (holding 2 strands together as one throughout) in first st across top.

Round 1 Ch1, *dc in each st and row-end to corner, (dc, ch2, dc) in corner; rep from * 3 times more, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off.

SURFACE CROCHET

Use Yarn A for surface crochet over Yarn B half of Panel and use Yarn B for surface crochet over Yarn A half.

Hold work so Yarn A Rows 1-28 are showing as the bottom half and the RS is facing.

Using the image as a guide and a 2.5mm hook, surface crochet the 6 stems. You could use a chalk pen to mark out the positions.

STAR

Using a 2mm hook and Yarn C, make magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 12htr in loop, ss to top of beg htr. [12 sts]

Round 2 Ch2 (counts as first leg of tr2tog), tr in next st, ch4, (tr2tog, ch4) 5 times, ss to top of beg tr2tog. [6 sts, 6 ch-4 sps]

Round 3 Ch1, *FPdc around tr2tog, (htr, tr, ch4, tr, htr) in ch-4 sp; rep from * around, ss to top of beg FPdc. [30 sts, 6 ch-4 sps]

Round 4 Ch1, dc in FPdc, dc in next 2 sts, *(dc, ch4 picot, 2dtr, ch1, ch6 picot, ch7 picot, ch6 picot, ss to ch1, 2dtr, ch4 picot, dc) in ch-4 sp, dc in next 5 sts; rep from * around, ss to top of beg dc.

Fasten off.

Sew to the centre of the front.

TO MAKE UP

Place Panels together with RS facing out.

Using a 4mm hook and 2 strands of Yarn C held together as one, join yarn in any corner of both Panels.

Round 1 Ch1, reverse dc around joining 3 sides, reverse dc across front only on final side, turn, reverse dc across unworked sts of back, ss to last joining st.

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Use a gold hoop to set off the embroidered holly motifs in this gorgeous contemporary

Round 2 *Ss into next st, (1dc, ch-2 picot, 1dc) in next st; rep from * 10 times more, ss in next 3 sts, ch4, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 2 ch (stalk made), ss to st at base of ch.

Fasten off.

Join Gold in bl of any st.

Round 3 *Ss in bl of each st to picot, (ch1, ss, ch1) in picot; rep from * around to end, ss in first ss.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Using Gold, sew the veins over the Holly.

HOLLY BERRIES (MAKE 7)

Using Gold, make a magic loop.

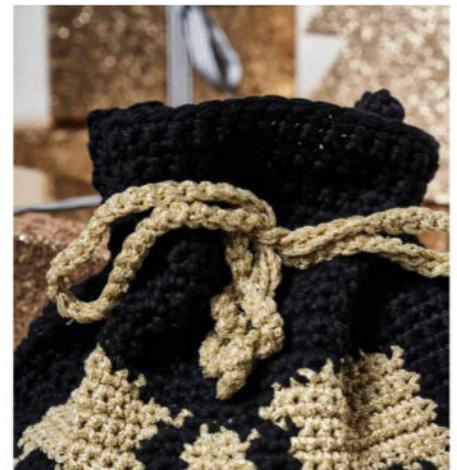

Row 8 Ch1, dc in first 12 sts, change to White, dc in next 6 sts, change to Black, dc in next 2 sts, change to White, dc in next 6 sts, change to Black, dc in next 12 sts, turn.

Rows 9-46 Cont in patt set, using the Chart for all colour changes.

Cont with Black.

Rows 47-52 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Row 53 Ch1, dc in first 3 sts, (skip 1 st, ch1, dc in next 5 sts) twice, skip 1 st, ch1, dc in next 6 sts, (skip 1 st, ch1, dc in next 5 sts) twice, skip 1 st, ch1, dc in final 3 sts, turn. [32 sts, 6 ch-1 sps]

Row 54 Ch1, dc in each st and ch-sp across, turn. [38 sts]

Rows 55-61 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

RIBBON

Using Gold, ch115.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch across. [114 sts]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

TO MAKE UP

Place Panels together with WS facing out.

Using Black, sew the sides and base together.

Turn so RS is facing out and weave the ribbon through the eyelets and secure with a bow.

Insert safety eyes between Rounds 12 and 13, 2 stitches apart.

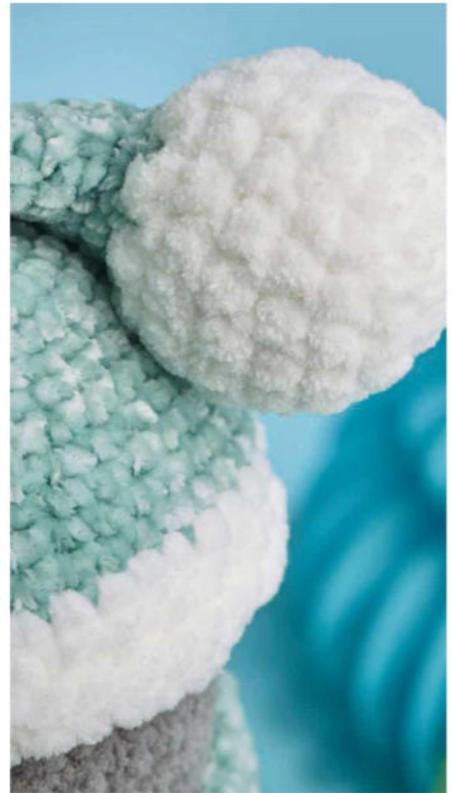

Round 2 Ch1, 2dc in next 2 sts, htr in next st, 2htr in next 4 sts, htr in next st, 2dc in next 2 sts, ss to first dc to join. [18 sts]

Round 3 Ch1, 2dc in next st, dc in next 3 sts, htr in next st, (2htr in next st, htr in next st) 4 times, dc in next 3 sts, 2dc in next st, dc in next st, ss to first dc to join. [24 sts]

Round 4 Ch1, 2dc in next st, dc in next 5 sts, htr in next st, (2htr in next st, htr in next 2 sts) 3 times, htr in next st, dc in next 5 sts, 2dc in next 2 sts, ss to first dc to join. [30 sts]

Round 5 Ch1, 2dc in next st, dc in next 7 sts, htr in next st, (2htr in next st, htr in next 3 sts) 3 times, htr in next st, dc in next 7 sts, 2dc in next st, ss to first dc to join. [35 sts]

Round 6 Ch1, 2dc in next st, dc in next 9 sts, htr in next st, (2htr in next st, htr in next 2 sts) 5

times, htr in next st, dc in next 7 sts, 2dc in next st, ss to first dc to join. [42 sts]

Change to Vapor Gray.

Round 7 Ch1, ss in each st around.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Sew Belly onto Body. Sew top of Belly on between Rounds 19 and 20 and the bottom of the Belly between Rounds 38 and 39.

FEET (MAKE 2)

Using Burnt Mustard Yarn, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 8dc in loop. [8 sts]

Round 2 Dc in each st around.

Round 3 (2dc, dc in next st) 4 times. [12 sts]

Rounds 4-5 Dc in each st around.

Round 6 (2dc, dc in next st) 6 times. [18 sts]

Round 7 (Dc2tog, dc in next st) 6 times. [12 sts]

Flatten final round and work 6ss across to close.

Fasten off, leaving long tail.

Sew onto the bottom of the Body, angled slightly outward. The top inside corners of each Foot should be sewn on Round 42 of the Body.

After both Feet are sewn on, use one of the remaining tails to sew the 2 Feet together on Rounds 1-4 of the Foot.

SCARF

Using Velveteal, ch75.

Row 1 (RS) Tr in third ch from hook and each ch across, turn. [73 sts].

Row 2 Ch3 (counts as tr), tr in each st across.

Fasten off and weave in ends.



Wings are worked in the round with a gentle curve on the sides, and are left unstuffed



Work the feet in rounds, then flatten and stitch the last round together to close the opening

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO USE STITCH MARKERS IN SPIRALS

In this pattern, you'll work the stitches in spiral rounds. If you've never done this before, don't worry, it's easy! At the end of a round, don't join the first and last stitches with a slip stitch. Instead, just work the first stitch of a new round into the top of the first stitch on the previous round. Using stitch markers will help you to keep track of spiral rounds. Our step-by-step guide (right) will show you how to do this.



1 Work the first stitch of a round and place a stitch marker in this first stitch.



2 Work a spiral round of double crochet stitches until you've worked the last stitch of the round. The next stitch you'll want to work into will have the stitch marker in it.



3 You'll need to remove the marker, work the first stitch of the new round and then replace the stitch marker in this first stitch, to mark the start of the round again.

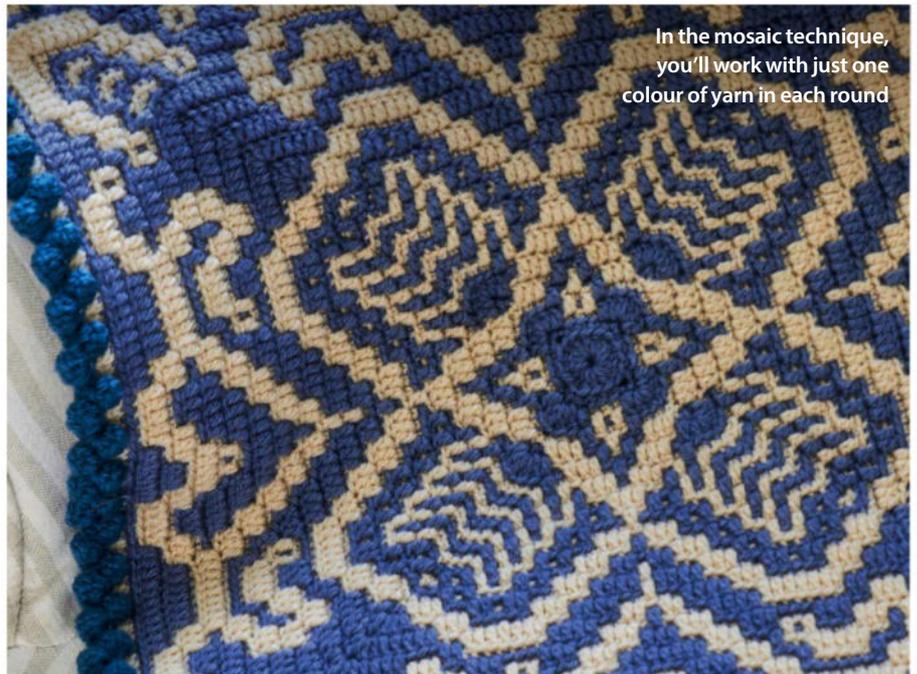

NOTES

Blanket is made up of 4 Squares. Squares are worked in rounds in the Overlay Mosaic technique. You can find more information on this technique here: www.gathered.how/knitting-and-crochet/crochet/how-to-mosaic-crochet
 Work with RS facing throughout, changing colour at the end of each round. Work over yarn tails where possible to reduce the number of ends you need to weave in.
 There is a Chart on page 122, which you will need to refer to when working the Squares. The Chart shows one side of the Motif only and needs to be repeated 4 times on each round. Each plain small square represents 1dc worked in the bl. Each x represents a tr2d (see Abbreviations).
 The first few rounds of the Chart have been written out to guide you.

BLANKET SQUARES (MAKE 4)

Use Vanilla Cream for Yarn A on all Squares. Use Cerulean Blue as Yarn B on 2 Squares and Jewel as Yarn B on the rem 2 Squares. Using Yarn B, make a magic loop.
Foundation round (RS) Ch3 (counts as tr throughout), 15tr in loop, ss to top of beg ch-3. [16 sts]
Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), (C in next st, dc in bl of next 3 sts) 4 times, ss to beg dc. [20 sts, 4 ch-1 sps]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn A in bl of any ch-1 sp.
Round 2 Ch1, (C in ch-1 sp, dc in bl of next 5 sts) 4 times, ss to beg dc. [28 sts, 4 ch-1 sps]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn B in bl of any ch-1 sp.
Round 3 Ch1, (CX in ch-sp 2 rounds below, tr2d, dc in bl of next 3 sts, tr2d) 4 times, ss to top of beg tr. [36 sts, 4 ch-1 sps]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn A in bl of any ch-1 sp.
Round 4 Ch1, (C in corner ch-1 sp, dc in bl of next 3 sts, tr2d, dc in bl of next st, tr2d, dc in bl of next 3 sts) 4 times, ss to beg dc. [44 sts, 4 ch-1 sps]

Rounds 5-39 Cont in patt set, using the Chart as you work.
Fasten off and weave in ends.

TO MAKE UP

Using the image as a guide, whipstitch the Squares together in a 2x2 formation.

BORDER

Join Vanilla Cream in any corner ch-1 sp.
Round 1 (RS) Ch3 (counts as tr), (tr, ch2, 2tr) in ch-sp, *tr in each st to next corner, (2tr, ch1, 2tr); rep from * to end, ss to beg ch-3.
Fasten off.
 Join Jewel in any ch-1 sp.
Round 2 Ch1, *(dc, ch1, dc) in corner, (5-tr cl in next st, dc in next 3 sts) rep across to next corner; rep from * 3 times more, ss to beg dc.
Round 3 Ss in ch-2 sp, ch1, *(dc, ch1, dc) in corner, (dc in next 2 sts, 5-tr cl in next st, dc in next st) rep across to next corner; rep from * 3 times more, ss to beg dc.
Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Start the socks from the cuff and work down to the toes

It's just not Christmas without a pair of socks under the tree! Don't forget to block them when you're done so they look their best.

NOTES

Socks are worked from the top down. Cuff is worked in short rows and seamed together. The Leg is worked around the row-end edge of the Cuff. Leg, Foot and Toes are worked in rounds leaving a space for the Heel. The Heel is worked onto the sock at the end. Parts of this pattern are worked using the amigurumi method. Work stitches continuously in a spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as

you work. Small size is shown outside the brackets, medium and large sizes are shown within brackets. Please note that the measurements are before blocking, and the crochet fabric will stretch length-wise and width-wise once blocked.

SOCKS (MAKE 2)

CUFF

Ch11.
Row 1 (WS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch to end, turn. [10 sts]
Row 2 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as a st throughout), dc in bl of each st to end, turn. Rep Row 2 another 38 (42: 46) times.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 42 (46: 50) dc evenly around.

Round 2 (RS) Dc in bl of each st around.

Round 2 sets dc back loop pattern.

Work in bl unless otherwise instructed.

Rounds 3-5 As Round 2.

Round 6 (2dc in next st, 20 (22: 24) dc) twice.

[44 (48: 52) sts]

Rounds 7-12 As Round 2.

Round 13 (2dc in next st, 21 (23: 25) dc) twice.

[46 (50: 54) sts]

Rounds 14-21 As Round 2.

Space is made for the Heel over the next round.

Round 22 Work 23 (25: 27) fdc, skip next 23 (25: 27) sts, dc in final 23 (25: 27) sts.

FOOT

Round 23 Dc in bl of each st around.

Rounds 24-26 As Round 23.

Round 27 (Dc2tog, 21 (23: 25) dc) twice.

[44 (48: 52) sts]

Rounds 28-32 As Round 23.

Round 33 (Dc2tog, 20 (22: 24) dc) twice.

[42 (46: 50) sts]

Rep Round 23 until the Foot measures 13 (13: 15)cm from Heel space.

TOES

Lay Sock flat with the Heel opening at the back, making sure that it's centred. Place markers at either end of last round so that there are 20 (22: 24) sts between the markers. Dc in bl to first marker to move start of round.

Do not work in bl only for Toe section.

Round 1 (RS) Dc2tog, dc to 2 sts before next marker, dc2tog, dc in marked st, dc2tog, dc to 2

sts before next marker, dc2tog, dc in final marked st. [38 (42: 46) sts]

Move the markers up as you work.

Round 2 Dc in each st around.

Round 3 Dc2tog, dc in each st to 2 sts before marker, dc2tog, dc in marked st, dc2tog, dc in each st to 2 sts before next marker, dc2tog, dc in final marked st. [34 (38: 42) sts]

Rep Rounds 2-3 another 3 (4: 5) times. [22 sts]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

With WS facing, flatten final round and sew closed.

HEEL

With RS facing join yarn at the bottom right corner of the heel opening to work across the back of the fdc.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 25 (27: 29) dc across foot side of Heel, pm in last st, 25 (27: 29) dc across skipped sts of Leg, pm in last st. [50 (54: 58) sts]

Round 2 Dc2tog, dc in each st to 2 sts before marker, dc2tog, dc in marked st, dc2tog, dc in each st to 2 sts before next marker, dc2tog, dc in st marked st. [46 (50: 54) sts]

Move markers up as you work.

Round 3 Dc in each st around.

Round 4 Dc2tog, dc in each st to 2 sts before marker, dc2tog, dc in marked st, dc2tog, dc in each st to 2 sts before next marker, dc2tog, dc in st marked st. [42 (46: 50) sts]

Rep Rounds 3-4 another 5 times. [22 (26: 30) sts]

Fasten off leaving a long tail.

With WS facing, flatten final round and sew closed.


TO FINISH

Weave in ends.

To wet block: soak socks in lukewarm water, squeeze out excess moisture and pin out to size, or place them on sock blockers. Allow to dry naturally.



Work in the back loops for a textured fabric – stripes are created naturally by the yarn



Leave a gap while working the leg and foot, then return to it to create the heel

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WASH YOUR CROCHET PIECES



1 Keep the yarn's ball band safe and check it for care information. The band will tell you what temperature to wash the yarn at and whether it can go in the machine or if it needs to be handwashed.



2 To handwash, soak for around 30 minutes in a bowl of lukewarm water with a mild detergent. Don't rub or you may felt the piece. Then rinse, unless you've used a non-rinsing detergent, such as Soak or Eucalan.



3 Lay the crochet item on top of a towel and roll up the towel to squeeze out excess moisture, making sure you do not wring.



4 Gently reshape the crochet item. Leave it to dry on a towel somewhere flat, such as on a board or a folded blanket. Pin out if needed. Never hang up an item to dry because its weight may stretch the yarn.

Looking to add some festive touches to your décor this season? Then this cheery cushion is just the ticket! The cushion's wonderful texture comes from mosaic crochet, a decorative technique where you work a pattern of double and treble crochet stitches. While our version gives candy cane vibes, you can easily change up the yarn shades to match your festive colour palette.

NOTES

Cushion is made up of three panels. Each panel is worked in rows throughout. Change colour on the final yrh of row and carry the unused colour up the edge of your work. The Front is worked in the mosaic technique. You will change colour every two rows, working in a pattern of dc and mtr sts (see abbreviations).



Whether it's in the hall, living room or bedroom, this cushion brings cheer!

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WORK THE MOSAIC TECHNIQUE



1 We've marked the skipped stitch 2 rows below to make them easier to see. On Rows 3-4 a ch-3 sp has been worked over the skipped sts.



2 Ch1, dc in each dc of row below to first ch-sp.



3 Work a treble into the first skipped stitch 3 rows below. Working in front of the ch-3 sps. Work a treble in each skipped st and a dc in each dc.



4 When you reach a point in the row that is showing a different colour, skip those sts and work a ch for each skipped st +1. We've worked a ch-3 in this example.

MOSAIC CUSHION

There is a Chart on page 126 which you will need to refer to when working the mosaic design for the Front. The first few rows of the Chart have been written out to guide you. Panels are joined together with a double crochet seam

CUSHION

FRONT

Using Yarn A, ch78.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch to end, turn. [77 sts]

Row 2 (WS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), dc in each st across, turn.
Change to Yarn B.

Row 3 Ch1, dc in first 22 sts, (ch2, skip 1 st, dc in next st) twice, dc in next 26 sts, (ch2, skip 1 st, dc in next st) twice, dc in final 21 sts, turn.

Row 4 Ch1, *dc in each st to ch-2 sp, ch2, skip ch-sp; rep from * to end, turn.
Change to Yarn A.

Row 5 Ch1, dc in first 22 sts, 1mtr, ch2, skip 1 dc, 1mtr, dc in next 27 sts, 1mtr, ch2, skip 1 dc, 1mtr, dc in last 22 dc, turn.

Row 6 Ch1, *dc in each st to ch-2 sp, ch2, skip ch-sp; rep from * to end, turn.
Change to Yarn B.

Row 7 Ch1, dc in first 20 sts, ch2, skip 1 st, dc in next 2 sts, 1mtr, dc in next 2 sts, ch2, skip 1 st, dc in next 23 sts, ch2, skip 1 st, dc in next 2 sts, 1mtr, dc in next 2 sts, ch2, skip 1 st, dc in final 20 sts, turn.

Row 8 Ch1, *dc in each st to ch-2 sp, ch2, skip ch-sp; rep from * to end, turn.
Change to Yarn A.

Rows 9-62 Cont in pattern set, referring to the Chart as you work.

Fasten off.

BACK (MAKE 2)

RIB

Using Yarn A, ch9.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch across, turn. [8 sts]

Row 2 Ch1, dc in bl of each st across, turn.
Rep Row 2 until Rib measures approx 40cm long.

Do not fasten off.

MAIN SECTION

Turn to work into row-end of Rib.

Row 1 (RS) Ch1, dc in each row-end across, turn.

Row 2 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Change to Yarn B.

Rep Row 2, changing colour every 2 rows, until Back measures 37cm long.

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Place Front down with WS facing up.

Place the Back Panels on the Front so the Rib overlaps near the centre and the RS of the Backs



The mosaic crochet stitches creates a snowflake-style pattern



The rib creates an envelope fastening for your cushion, as well as even more texture

Pin the Panels together to secure them and turn so the RS of the Front is facing you.

Join Yarn A in any corner and work next round through all layers to join (make sure the carried yarns are hidden on the inside of the cushion cover).

Fasten off.

With RS facing, join yarn in fl of marked st.

Row 2 (RS) (Ch4, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 2 ch, ss in fl at base of ch-4, ss in next fl of Row 1) 16 times, turn. [16 strands]

Row 3 Ch1, dc in unworked loop of each dc from Row 1, turn. [16 sts]

Row 4 (Ch5, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 3 ch, ss in st at base of ch-5, ss in next st from last row) 16 times, turn.

Row 5 Ch20, ss in st at base of beg ch-5 from last row, turn.

Strands are worked from the fl of each ch of ch-20 of last row.

Row 6 Ss in first 2 ch, ch17, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 15 ch, ss in next unworked ch from ch-20, (ch18, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 16 ch, ss in next ch from ch-20) twice, (ch19, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 17 ch, ss in next ch from ch-20) twice, (ch20, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 18 ch, ss in next ch from ch-20) twice, (ch21, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 19 ch, ss in next ch from ch-20) twice, (ch20, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 18 ch, ss in next ch from ch-20) twice, (ch19, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 17 ch, ss in next ch from ch-20) twice, (ch18, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 17 ch, ss in next ch from ch-20) twice, ch17, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next 15 ch, ss in next ch from ch-20,



Make strands by working slip stitches into lengths of chains to form the beard

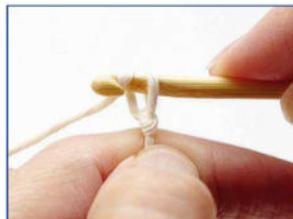

Fasten off and weave in ends.

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WORK CHAINS



1 Hold the hook and yarn end in your right hand, and the working yarn in your left hand. Move the hook under and over the yarn to wrap it around anti-clockwise.



2 Pull the hook towards the slip knot, catching the yarn in the hook, and pulling it through the slip knot loop. This forms the first chain (ch) stitch. Repeat Steps 1 and 2 to form a chain.



3 This is what the row of chains will look like. Hold the chain with your right hand near the hook, to keep the tension. Keep going until you have the number of chains stated on the pattern.



4 Each chain or loop counts as 1 stitch. Do not count the slip knot or the loop on the hook (called the working loop). For accuracy, make sure the chain is not twisted and that the front is facing you.

NOSE

Using Red, ch4.

Row 1 (RS) 4tr in last ch from hook, remove live loop from hook, insert hook in top of beg ch, place live loop on hook and pull through.

Fasten off.

HEAD (MAKE 2)

Using Light Brown, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), 6dc in loop. [6 sts]

Round 2 (RS) 2dc in each st around. [12 sts]

Round 3 (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [18 sts]

Round 4 (Dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [24 sts]

Round 5 (Dc in next 3 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [30 sts]

Fasten off.

Sew the Nose to the centre of one piece to make front of Head.

Using Black, embroider the eyes over Round 3.



It's isn't a proper Christmas reindeer without a red nose!



The teddy bear's ears are attached to the head using dc stitches

TO MAKE UP

Antlers are worked as you join the Heads together. Place markers where the antlers will be placed, centred around the eyes and approx 5 sts apart.

Place heads together with RS facing out and work next round through both pieces to join. Join Coffee in st base of Head so there are 11 sts to the first marker.

Round 1 Ch1, dc in each st to first marker, *dc in marked st, ch10, ss in second ch from hook, ss in

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WORK DOUBLE CROCHET INTO A RING



1 Make a foundation ring, then work the t-ch (1ch for dc). Work stitches as you would on a row, but insert the hook into the centre of the ring rather than each chain loop.



2 For a double crochet stitch, yrh and pull yarn through the centre of the loop (2 loops on hook). Finish the stitch in the usual way with yrh and pull yarn through both loops.



3 Work more dc in the round like this, as instructed in the pattern, pushing the stitches closer if you need to.



4 Use a slip stitch to join the last stitch to the top of the first dc stitch (not the t-ch when working in dc).

BOOKMARKS

NOSE

Using Coffee, work as Nose for Reindeer.

EARS (MAKE 2)

Using Light Beige, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc in loop. [6 sts]

Round 2 (RS) 2dc in each st around. [12 sts]

Round 3 (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [18 sts]

Fasten off.

HEAD (MAKE 2)

Work as Reindeer Head, making one using Light Brown throughout and the second using Light Beige for Rounds 1-2 and Light Brown for Rounds 3-5.

Fasten off.

Sew the Nose to the centre of Head with Light Beige centre.

Using Black, embroider the eyes over Round 4.

TO MAKE UP

Ears are joined as you join to the Heads pieces together. Place markers where the Ears will be placed, centred around the eyes and approx 7 sts apart.

Place heads together with RS facing out and work next round through both pieces to join. Join Light Brown in st base of Head so there are 10 sts to the first marker.

Round 1 Ch1, dc in each st to first marker, *fold Ear in Half with RS facing in, dc in next st on head and 2 sts at fold of Ear, dc in next 16 sts on Ear**, dc in next 7 sts on Head; rep from * to ** once more, dc in each st to end stuffing as you join, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off.

STRING AND TAIL

Wind off a second small ball of Light Brown.

Using 2 strands, make a ch that's 25cm long.

Fasten off one strand only.

Ch2, 12dc in second ch from hook, ss in ch at base of String.

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

Round 8 (4dc, dc2tog) twice. [10 sts]

Rounds 9-10 Dc in each st around.

Round 11 (3dc, dc2tog) twice. [8 sts]

Rounds 12-13 Dc in each st around.

Stuff up to Round 6 only.

Flatten final round and work 4dc across to close.

Fasten off.

CUFF

Join Cream in any unused fl from Round 3.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, dc in each fl around, ss to beg dc. [12 sts]

EARS (MAKE 2)

Using Brown, make a magic loop.

Rounds 1-4 As Rounds 1-4 of Arms. [12 sts]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

HAT

Using Olive, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 3dc in loop. [3 sts]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [6 sts]

Round 3 (Dc, 2dc into next st) 3 times. [9 sts]

Round 4 (2dc, 2dc into next st) 3 times. [12 sts]

Round 5 (3dc, 2dc into next st) 3 times. [15 sts]

Round 6 (4dc, 2dc into next st) 3 times. [18 sts]

Round 7 (5dc, 2dc into next st) 3 times. [21 sts]

Round 8 (6dc, 2dc into next st) 3 times. [24 sts]

Round 9 (7dc, 2dc into next st) 3 times. [27 sts]

Change to Wine Red.

Round 10 Dc in each st around.

Round 11 (Working in fl only) (Ss in next st, ch3, tr in the third ch from hook, skip 2 sts) 9 times, ss to first ss.



Small details such as the cheeks and eyebrows really give your bear personality

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

POMPOM

Using Cream, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc in loop. [6 sts]

Round 2 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Thread tail through fl of final 6 sts and pull tight to close.

Sew to the top of the Hat.

SNOUT

Using Ecru, ch4.

Round 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in next ch, 3dc in final ch, turn to work down opposite side of foundation ch, dc in next ch, 2dc in final ch. [8 sts]

Dc into first st of the previous round to move start of round.

Round 2 (1dc, 2dc in next 3 sts) twice. [14 sts]

Round 3 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off.

Using Nougat, embroider the nose.

HEAD AND BODY

Using Brown, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 8dc in loop. [8 sts]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [16 sts]

Round 3 (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) 8 times. [24 sts]

Round 4 (Dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st) 8 times. [32 sts]

Rounds 5-6 Dc in each st around.

Round 7 (3dc, 2dc into next st) 8 times. [40 sts]

Round 8 (4dc, 2dc into next st) 8 times. [48 sts]

Rounds 9-14 Dc in each st around.



BEAR

Insert safety eyes between Rounds 11-12, approx 8 sts apart.

Using Nilli Nilli Cream, embroider eyebrows over Round 9.

Using Salmon, embroider cheeks over Rounds 12-13.

Stuff as you go.

Round 15 (6dc, dc2tog) 6 times. [42 sts]

Round 16 (5dc, dc2tog) 6 times. [36 sts]

Round 17 (4dc, dc2tog) 6 times. [30 sts]

Round 18 (3dc, dc2tog) 6 times. [24 sts]

Round 19 Ss in each st around.

Change to Cream.

Round 20 (3dc, 2dc into next st) 6 times.

[30 sts]

Change to Olive, leave strand of Cream on RS to use later to make the Collar.

Round 21 Dc in bl of each st around.

Rounds 22-24 Dc in each st around.

Round 25 (4dc, 2dc into next st) 6 times. [36 sts]

Rounds 26-28 Dc in each st around.

Change to Black.

Round 29 Ss in fl of each st around.

Round 30 Dc in bl of each st from Round 28.

Change to Olive.

Round 31 Dc in bl of each st around.

Change to Cream.

Round 32 Dc in bl of each st around.

Rounds 33-34 Dc in each st around.

Mark out central 2 sts at front and back of the Body. This will form the gusset between the legs and will be sewn closed later. There should be 16 sts for each leg either side of the marked sts.

Dc so live st is at the back of the Body, but not in either of the central 2 sts.

Change to Wine Red and place live loop on marker.

COLLAR

Join Cream in any unused fl from Round 20 with a ss.

Round 1 (Skip 1 st, 4htr in next st, skip 1 st, ss in next 2 sts) 6 times.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

LEGS (MAKE 2)

Place live loop on marker from Body.

Round 1 (RS) 16dc around one Leg space.

[16 sts]

Change to Cream.

Round 2 Dc in each st around.

Change to Wine Red.

Round 3 As Round 2.

Stuff Leg as you work.

Change to Cream.

Round 4 As Round 2.

Change to Black.

Round 5 As Round 2.

Round 6 (Working in bl only) (Dc2tog) 8 times.

[8 sts]

Fasten off.

Thread tail through fl of final 8 sts and pull tight to close. Weave in end.

Rep to make second Leg.

Using Cream, sew the gap between the legs closed.

SHIRT EXTENSION

Position the bear upside down, with back facing.

Join Olive in unused fl of Round 30.

Round 1 Dc in each fl around.

Round 2 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Lightly stuff the Snout and sew over Rounds 12-15 of Head.

Sew the Ears over Rounds 5-8 of Head.

Sew the Arms over Rounds 21-22 of Body.

Using Wine Red, embroider the buttons.

Lightly stuff the Hat and sew to the top of the Head.

Weave in all ends.

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO CHANGE COLOUR IN A SPIRAL



1 If you need to work stripes in a spiral, the pattern will ask you to change colour. Always do this on the last yrh of the last stitch of the round in the previous colour.



2 Work the first stitch of the new round in the new colour and place a stitch marker in this first stitch.



3 Work a round of double crochet stitches until you've worked the last stitch of the round. The next stitch you'll want to work into will have the stitch marker in it.



4 You'll need to remove the marker, work the first stitch of the new round and then replace the stitch marker in this first stitch, to mark the start of the round again.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3 (counts as tr throughout), 2tr in loop, (ch2, 3tr in loop) 3 times, ch2 ss to top of beg ch-3. [12 sts]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn A in any ch-2 sp.

Round 2 (RS) Ch3, (2tr, ch2, 3tr, ch1) in same sp, (3tr, ch2, 3tr, ch1) in each ch-2 sp around, ss to top of beg ch-3.

Fasten off.

JAYG SQUARES

Work Round 1 as First Square.

Join Yarn A in any ch-2 sp.

JAYG round Ch3, 2tr in same sp, ch1, live loop join in ch-2 sp on adjacent Square, ch1, *3 tr joins in same ch-sp as last tr on current Square, ch1, 3 tr joins in next ch-2 sp, ch1, live loop join in ch-2 sp on adjacent Square, ch1; rep from * once more if joining 2 sides, complete as Round 2 on First Square.

Fasten off.

BACK AND FRONT FLAP

Back and Front Flap is made up of 42 Squares, joined as 6x7.

Work Squares as for Front.

SIDES (MAKE 2)

Each Side is made up of 4 Squares, joined in a single strip.

Work Squares as for Front.

BASE

Base is made up of 6 Squares, joined in a single strip.

Work Squares as for Front.

STRAP

Strap is made up of 20 Squares, joined in a single strip.

Work Squares as for Front.

TO MAKE UP

Block panels to measurements listed.
Cut 5 pieces of interfacing as follows:



Lining the bag gives it stability and helps to hold its boxy shape over the long-term

1 to measurements of Base, 2 to measurements of Sides, 2 to measurements of Front.

Panels are joined together with a dc seam, worked with RS facing.

Join the Sides to either end of the Base.

Join the Front to the Base and Sides.

Join the Back to the Base and Sides, the Flap should extend 3 motifs above the ends of the Sides.

Do not join the Strap.

EDGING

Join Yarn A in any st around Flap, work a round of dc around edge of Flap and top of Front.

Join Strap to top of Sides.

BUTTON LOOP

Join Yarn A in centre of Flap, ch8, ss in base of ch-8, turn.

Row 1 Ch1, 8dc in loop, turn.

Row 2 Ss in each dc.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

TO FINISH

Cut 2 pieces of lining fabric to measurements of each interfacing, plus 1cm for joining.

Sandwich interfacing between facing and sew around to enclose.

Sew the lining together to form the Bag shape, insert into Bag and secure around the top edge.

Sew the button to the Front, in line with the Button Loop.

Rows 3-4 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Row 5 Ch1, 2dc in each st across, turn. [4 sts]

Rows 6-7 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Row 8 Ch1, 2dc in first st, dc in each st to final st, 2dc in final st, turn. [6 sts]

Rows 9-10 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Rows 11-40 Row Rows 8-10. [26 sts]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

SANTA TRIANGLES (MAKE 39)

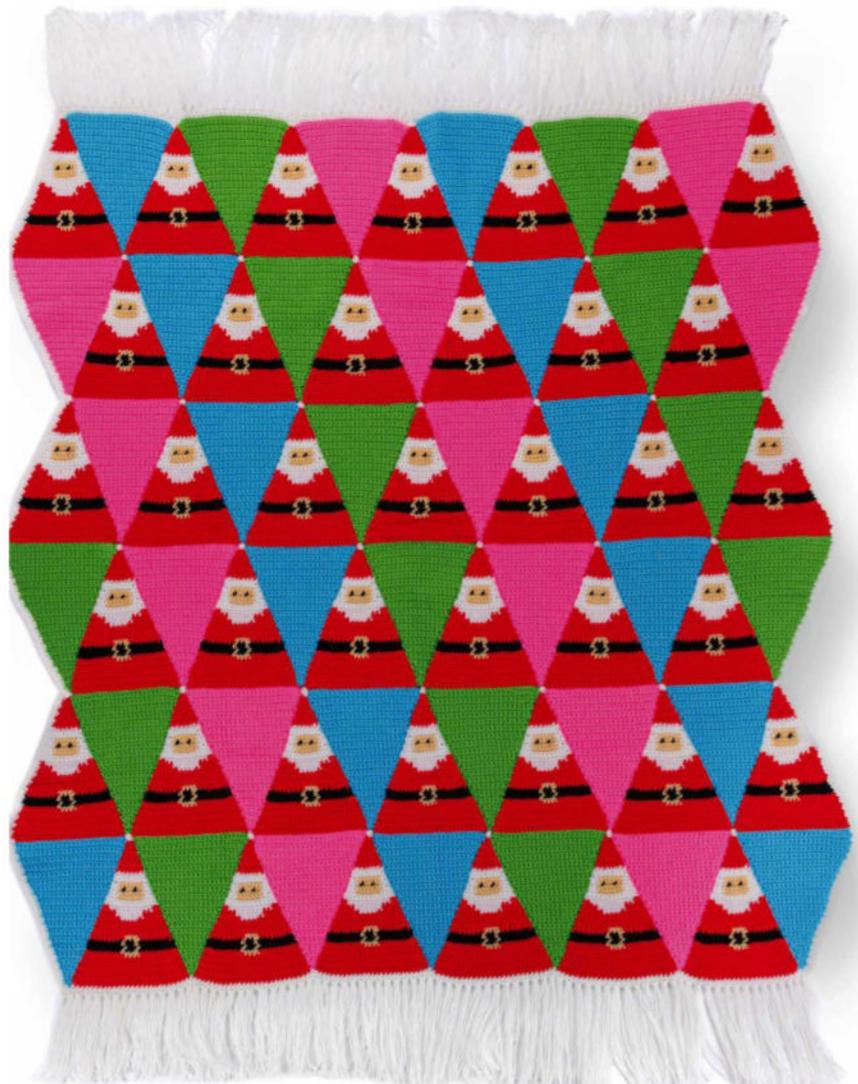
Using Yarn D, ch2.

Row 1 (RS) Bobble in second ch from hook, turn. [1 st]

Change to Yarn E.

Row 2 Ch1, 2dc in bobble, turn. [2 sts]

Round 2 Ch1, dc in each st around, working 2dc in centre of every 3-dc group and dc3tog across every 'valley' at side, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off.

TO FINISH

Cut 4 lengths of Yarn D, approx 40cm long. Attach along either straight edge with a lark's head knot. Add fringe evenly across both straight edges in same way. Trim fringe to desired length. Weave in any rem ends.

Finish off the blanket in style with a fringe of lark's head knots



SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO ADD FRINGING



1 Follow the instructions in the pattern, or try this method. Cut 2 pieces of yarn, twice as long as you want the fringe to be. Fold in half.



2 Insert hook through the edge of the fabric, where you want the first piece of fringing to be placed. Loop the yarn lengths over the hook and pull back through the fabric.



3 Pull the yarn lengths to make a small loop next to the fabric. Pass the ends of the yarn lengths through this loop and pull tight to secure.



4 Repeat from step 1 along the edge of the fabric, as close together or far apart as you wish. Use a matching or contrasting yarn colour. Trim any uneven lengths of yarn to create a neat finish.

Round 11 (1dc, dc2tog) 6 times. [12 dc]

Fasten off.

Sew final round closed.

NOSE

Using orange, ch4.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in next 2 ch. [3 dc]

Fasten off.

Sew Nose to Head.

Using black, embroider eyes and mouth.

HAT

Using black, ch7.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in next 5 ch, turn. [6 dc]

Rows 2-4 Ch1, 6dc, turn. [6 dc]

Row 5 Ch2, dc in second ch from hook, 6dc, ch2, dc in second ch from hook, ss into end of Row 4.

Fasten off.



Make the snowman's head as a sphere and flatten it, then sew the other pieces onto it

HAT RIBBON

Using purple, ch6.

Fasten off.

Sew over Rows 3-4 of Hat.

Sew the Hat to the Head.

SCARF

Using purple, ch4.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in next 2 ch, turn. [3 dc]

Row 2 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Change to green.

Rows 3-18 As Row 2, changing colour every 2 rows between purple and green.



Chenille yarn makes this chap super soft to cuddle, and we love his roguish expression. Your little ones won't want to put him down!

NOTES

Elf is made up of different pieces, which are joined together at the end. Leave long tails when fastening off to use when joining. The pattern is worked using the amigurumi method. Work stitches continuously in a spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as you work. If you are making this as a toy for a child under 36 months, do not use safety eyes; instead, embroider eyes using Yarn G. This has been designed as a toy, but if you would prefer a comforter style, leave the Body unstuffed.

ELF

HEAD

Using Yarn B, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), 8dc in a loop. [8 sts]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [16 sts]

Round 3 (2dc in next st, dc in next st) 8 times. [24 sts]

Round 4 (2dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts) 8 times. [32 sts]

Rounds 5-7 Dc in each st around.

Round 8 (2dc in next st, dc in next 3 sts) 8 times. [40 sts]

Rounds 9-18 Dc in each st around.

Place safety eyes between Rounds 11-12, approx 3 sts apart.

Stuff as you go.

Round 19 (Dc2tog, dc in next 3 sts) 8 times. [32 sts]

Round 20 (Dc2tog, dc in next 2 sts) 8 times. [24 sts]

Round 21 (Dc2tog, dc in next st) 8 times. [16 sts]

Round 22 (Dc2tog) 8 times. [8 sts]

Fasten off.

Thread tail through fl of final 8 sts and pull tight to close.

HAIR

Using Yarn C around post of any st from Round 3 of Head.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, FPdc around st, ch14, (FPdc around next st, ch14) 23 times, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

FACIAL DETAILS

Use the images as a guide when working facial details.

Using Yarn B, embroider a nose.

Using Yarn F, embroider whites around lower section of each eye.

Using Yarn G, embroider eyelids, eyebrows and mouth.



Embroider a bobbly nose and curvy lines to give your elf unique facial characteristics

EARS (MAKE 2)

Using Yarn B, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 4dc in loop. [4 sts]

Round 2 Dc in each st around.

Round 3 (2dc in next st, 1dc) twice. [6 sts]

Round 4 Dc in each st around.

Round 5 (2dc in next st, 1dc) 3 times. [9 sts]

Round 6 Dc in each st around.

Round 7 (2dc in next st, 2dc) 3 times. [12 sts]

Round 8 Dc in each st around.

Rounds 9-11 Dc in 3 sts, tr in next 4 sts, dc in next 5 sts. [12 sts]

Round 12 (Dc2tog) 6 times. [6 sts]

Fasten off.

Thread tail through fl of final 6 sts and pull tight to close.

HAT

Using Yarn D, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 8dc in a loop. [8 sts]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [16 sts]

Rounds 3-5 Dc in each st around.

Round 6 (Dc2tog) 8 times. [8 sts]

Round 7 Dc in each st around.

Change to Yarn A.

Round 8 Dc in each st around.

Round 9 (2dc in next st, 3dc) twice. [10 sts]

Round 10 Dc in each st around.

Round 11 (2dc in next st, 4dc) twice. [12 sts]

Round 12 Dc in each st around.

Round 13 (2dc, 1dc) 6 times. [18 sts]

Rounds 14-15 Dc in each st around.

Round 16 (2dc in next st, 2dc) 6 times. [24 sts]

Rounds 17-19 Dc in each st around.

Round 20 (2dc in next st, 3dc) 6 times. [30 sts]

Rounds 21-23 Dc in each st around.

Round 24 (2dc in next st, 4dc) 6 times. [36 sts]

Round 25 Dc in each st around.

Round 26 (2dc in next st, 5dc) 6 times. [42 sts]

Round 27 Dc in each st around.

Round 28 Ss in every st around.

Fasten off.

BODY

Turn the head upside down with the nose facing away from you.

Join Yarn D around post of any st from Round 22 of Head.

Round 1 (RS) Ch2 (does not count as st throughout), FPtr around each st around, ss to beg tr. [8 sts]

Round 2 Ch2, (2tr in next st, tr in next st) 4 times, ss to beg tr. [12 sts]

Round 3 Ch2 (2tr in next st, tr in next st) 6 times, ss to beg tr. [18 sts]

Round 4 Ch2, tr in each st around, ss to beg tr.

Round 5 Ch2, (2tr in next st, tr in next 2 sts) 6 times, ss to beg tr. [24 sts]

Round 6 Ch2, tr in each st around, ss to beg tr.

Round 7 Ch2, (2tr in next st, tr in next 3 sts) 6 times, ss to beg tr. [30 sts]

Round 8 Ch2, tr in each st around, ss to beg tr.

Change to Yarn E.

Round 9 Ch2, tr in each st around, ss to beg tr. Change Yarn D.

Round 10 Ch2, tr in each st around, ss to beg tr. Stuff as you work.

Round 11 Ch2, (tr2tog, tr in next 3 sts) 6 times, ss to beg tr. [24 sts]

Round 12 Ch2, (tr2tog, tr in next 2 sts) 6 times, ss to beg tr. [18 sts]

Flatten final round and work 9dc evenly across to close.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

ARMS (MAKE 2)

Using Yarn B, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 8dc in a loop. [8 sts]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [16 sts]

Rounds 3-4 Dc in each st around.

Change to Yarn D.

Round 5 (Dc2tog, dc in next 2 sts) 4 times. [12 sts]

Round 6 Dc in each st around.

Round 7 (Dc2tog, dc in next 2 sts) 3 times. [9 sts]

Round 8 Dc in each st around.

Stuff to Round 8.

Round 9 (Dc2tog, dc in next st) 3 times. [6 sts]

Rounds 10-14 Dc in each st around. [9 sts]

Fasten off.

SCARF

Using Yarn A, ch40.

Row 1 Tr in third ch from the hook, tr in each ch across. [38 sts]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

FEET (MAKE 2)

Using Yarn D, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc in a loop. [6 sts]

Round 2 Dc in each st around.

Round 3 (Dc2tog, 1dc) twice. [4 sts]

Change to Yarn A.

Rounds 4-5 Dc in each st around. [4 sts]

Round 6 2dc in each st around. [8 sts]

Rounds 7-8 Ss in next 4 sts, tr in next 4 sts. [8 sts]

Round 9 2dc in next 4 sts, tr in next 2 sts, 2tr in next 2 sts. [14 sts]

Rounds 10-11 Dc in each st around.

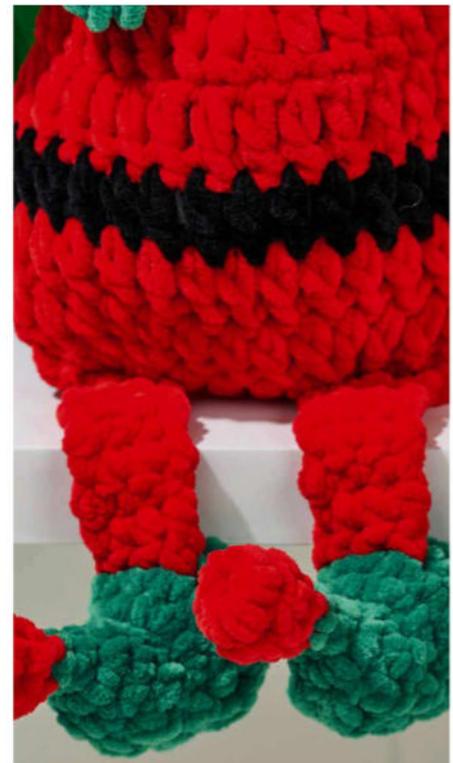
Lightly stuff.

Round 12 (Dc2tog, dc in next 5 sts) twice. [12 sts]

Round 13 (Dc2tog) 6 times. [6 sts]

Fasten off.

Thread tail through fl of final 6 sts and pull tight to close.



Stuff the elf's feet before working the legs, but leave the legs unstuffed for flexibility

LEGS (MAKE 2)

With Foot facing you, join Yarn D around post of stitch from Round 10 of Foot.

Row 1 Ch1, FPdc around next 3 sts, turn. [3 sts]

Rows 2-8 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Sew the tops of the Legs to the base of Body.


Sew the Hat to the Head.

Sew the Arms either side of the Body.

Sew the Ears to the Head.

Weave in all ends.

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WORK A MAGIC LOOP




1 To start a magic loop, don't make a slipknot. Instead, make a loop with the yarn, leaving a tail around 10cm long. Make sure the tail end is under the working yarn.



2 Insert your hook into the loop, from front to back. Wrap the working yarn round the hook anticlockwise and pull the yarn through the loop.



3 Make a t-ch for the sts you want to work (above, we made 1 t-ch for dc). Now work the sts into the magic loop, making sure you work over both the loop and the tail end (so, 2 yarn strands).



4 Once you've worked all the stitches you need, pull the tail end of the yarn to close the ring. Work a slip stitch to join the first and last stitches to finish the first round.

Wrap up Christmas!

We've put together a step-by-step guide to help you plan your time and your crochet projects in the run up to 25 December

As you're reading this magazine, there's a very good chance you'd like to hook up some gorgeous crocheted goodies for Christmas gifts. But you may also be wondering how you're going to fit in all the projects you want to do. So we're here to help. Crocheting in the lead-up to Christmas is a wonderful way to spend your time. Think of it as a way to fit in a bit of relaxation – and you'll be making gifts at the same time. It's a win-win!

FIRST THINGS FIRST

Whether you can dedicate a lot of time to making or just a little, spending some time planning at the start of the process is well worth it. Ask yourself if you really want to make gifts, or is this the year you would prefer to crochet some decorations for your home? If that's what you would like, don't feel guilty about it – other people will love to see them.

If you're doubting whether you will really have the time to crochet anything much, think about making an addition to an item, rather than making a large project. Making crochet chains or even simply using leftover sparkly yarn are fun ways to tie up presents rather than using ribbons and bows. Pompoms are another easy idea for zhuzhing up wrapping, and it's a way to get the kids involved, too. A couple of tiny gift tag snowflakes won't take

long, and they'll add a super handmade touch to carefully wrapped presents.

Another option is to add motifs to cards for an extra-special gift package. Traditional motifs such as Christmas tree, holly and snowman shapes work well, or raid half-done projects for graphic motifs that will look contemporary.

GET ORGANISED

Deciding on what you want to make, and who deserves the fruits of your crochet labours at the start of the process is a good way to get organised. There's no point in slaving over a beautiful, intricate project for weeks to give to someone who just won't appreciate it. Save your efforts for those who do!

Creating gifts for Christmas works best when you know exactly what you want to do. Make a list of what you want to make and who for, estimate how much time each project will take and put them in some kind of order. We'd recommend you intersperse larger projects with smaller ones to give your hands a break, give your brain a change of scene and keep up the motivation.

Don't forget to allow for social events ramping up this time of year; school plays and concerts, shopping, Christmas markets, work parties and so on can eat up evenings and weekends, so you may only have two or three

out of every seven evenings to play with. Be realistic and make your list to suit.

Even for those who appreciate your time and trouble, not everyone needs gifts that take weeks to crochet. Stick to one or two larger projects, be realistic about what you can take on, and plan to include plenty of small WIPs in between bigger projects. Decorations or jewellery that you can finish in under an hour or so are perfect. If you know someone is getting a new coat, you could make them a brooch to go with it. Other quick and easy projects include potholders, phone cosies, coasters and face scrubbies. Make up some folders or small bags for each item containing the yarn, pattern and hook so you can grab one on your way out of the door. Train journeys, picking up the kids and sitting in waiting rooms all provide small pockets of otherwise wasted time; you'll be surprised at how much you can achieve.

SORT YOUR SUPPLIES

Remember to buy your yarn requirements well in advance, as if something is out of stock, there will still be time to reassess. If a particular colour is unavailable, can you find another in the same range that will work as well? If not, and especially if the yarn is an unusual weight or composition, don't be afraid to change the pattern you wanted to make entirely, rather

than try to substitute a yarn which may not work as well.

For smaller items, don't forget about your stash. Sort through it to see if there are weights and colours you'd like to use, and be creative – Christmas decorations come in all kinds of colours these days, and you don't have to stick to red, white and green. Even small amounts of metallics can be used as trims. If you don't have enough to crochet around your tree decs, consider embroidery. A simple running stitch made around an edge is effective, or a length of yarn (or thread) can be caught with a stitch at regular intervals to form a scalloped edge. You'll both be making space (for yarny gifts?) and saving money.

Whether you're buying new supplies in your local shop or online, try to make just one order and stick to what you need. It will save you time and money travelling into town, or potentially lots of postage costs.

CHRISTMAS SPIRIT

It's important to find ways to make it fun – this is supposed to be a time to enjoy yourself! Watching Christmas films while working your way through your list can make things magical, especially if you can snuggle up on

the sofa with a hot chocolate (or a mulled wine!), perhaps with your significant other and the children.

Lastly, don't put too much pressure on yourself! It's not the end of the world if you don't get something finished in time. Work out where you are with all the gifts you'd like to make every couple of weeks so that you have time to buy something instead, if it looks like you're not going to finish. There are lots of craft fairs on this time of the year, too – you can always get into the Christmas spirit and give someone else's craft making a boost. In the event you find yourself with extra moments you can always make more; you might even fit in crafting something for yourself!

Remember too, that most of the time the recipient doesn't even know they were going to get something special. It's your decision what to give them. Even if they do know, taking the option of giving them a small gift to open with an IOU for their crochet gift, is a good way to alleviate the stress.

If you do make it through and get your gifts made and wrapped in time, it's worth all the effort when you see the look on someone's face when they open their special handmade gift. And it's all down to you.

Round 3 (Dc in next 8 sts, 2dc in next st, dc in next 8 sts) 3 times, turn leaving rem sts unworked. [54 sts]

Round 4 Ch1, (dc in next 17 sts, 2dc in next st) 3 times, (dc in next 8 sts, 2dc in next st, dc in next 8 sts) 3 times, turn. [111 sts]

Round 5 Ch1, (dc in next 17 sts, 2dc in next st) 3 times, dc in next 53 sts, (dc2tog) twice, turn. [112 sts]

Round 6 Ch1, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 104 sts, (dc2tog) twice, turn. [108 sts]

Round 7 Ch1, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 100 sts, (dc2tog) twice, turn. [104 sts]

Round 12 (Dc in next 3 sts, invdec) 4 times. [16 sts]

Round 13 (Dc in next 2 sts, invdec) 4 times. [12 sts]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Sew Ears to top of Body.

TO FINISH

Cut a length of ribbon and tie to the top of each Bauble.

Emma Leith has delved into memories of humbugs and gobstoppers to make a wreath with candy-striped spirals

- West Yorkshire Spinners Signature 4ply (75% wool, 25% nylon, 100g/400m), 1 ball of each: **Yarn A** Marshmallow (0011), **Yarn B** Candyfloss (0547), **Yarn C** Rouge (1000), **Yarn D** Sunflower (1001), **Yarn E** Chocolate Lime (0395), **Yarn F** Turmeric (0358), **Yarn G** Blueberry Bonbon (0365), **Yarn H** Poppy Seed (600)
- A 3mm (US C/2 or D/3) hook
- Polystyrene wreath, 17cm diameter

TENSION

Tension is not critical

MEASUREMENTS

Wreath measures approx 21cm (8¼in) in diameter

ABBREVIATIONS

fhtr (foundation double crochet) Ch3 (counts as first st), insert hook in last ch from hook, yrh and pull up a loop, pull through one loop on hook (loop will sit at base of fhtr), yrh and pull through 3 loops on hook, *insert hook in loop at base of prev fhtr, yrh and pull up a loop, pull through one loop on hook (loop will sit at base of fhtr), yrh and pull through 3 loops on hook; rep from * as required

NOTES

Wreath is made up of a Cover and Spirals. Cover is worked in rows and seamed together around the polystyrene wreath. Instructions are included for using a different-sized wreath. Spirals are made separately and sewn to the Wreath.

SPIRAL WREATH

COVER

Using Yarn A, work a row of fhtr to fit around wreath; we worked 17 sts for our wreath.

Row 1 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout) htr in each st across, turn.

Change to Yarn B.

Rows 2-3 Ch1, htr in each st across, turn.

Change to Yarn A.

Rep Row 2, changing colour every 2 rows between Yarn A and B, until piece measures circumference of wreath. We worked 32 rows.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Wrap around the polystyrene wreath and whipstitch row-end edges together. Sew the final row to the base of Row 1.

SPIRALS (MAKE 110)

Work spirals with 2 strands of yarn held together as 1 throughout.



Make 60 using 2 strands of Yarn A.

Make rem Spirals using 1 strand of Yarn A and 1 strand of any other colour.

Ch11.

Row 1 2dc in second ch from hook, 2dc in each ch to end.

Fasten off.

TO FINISH

Pin the Spirals to the front of the Wreath. Once happy with the position, sew in place.

Weave in all ends.

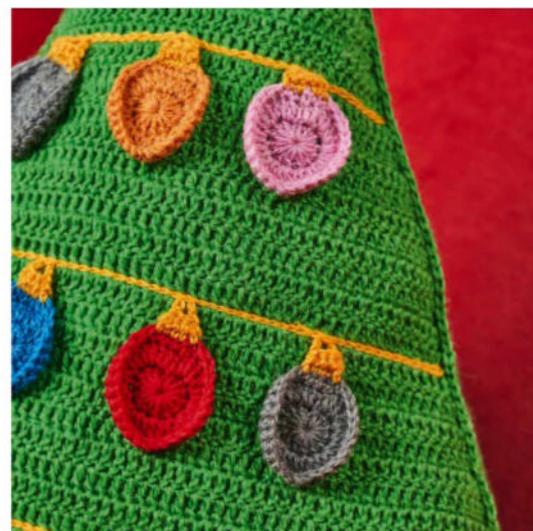

Cushion measures approx 46x46cm (18x18in) at widest point

ABBREVIATIONS

surface crochet Position yarn on WS, insert hook from RS to WS, yrh and pull up a loop, pull through loop on hook, *insert hook back through to WS in direction you want the



surface crochet to travel, yrh and pull up a loop, pull through loop on hook; rep from * as required

NOTES

Cushion is made in 1 piece, which is folded and joined at the sides. Baubles are made separately and attached using surface crochet. Star is made separately and sewn on.

TREE CUSHION

Using Chocolate Lime, make a magic loop.

Row 1 (RS) Ch2 (does not count as st throughout), 2tr in loop, turn. [2 sts]

Row 2 (WS) Ch2, 2tr in each st, turn. [4 sts]

Row 3 Ch2, 2tr in first st, tr in each st to last st, 2tr in last st, turn. [6 sts]

Rows 4-60 Repeat Row 2. [120 sts]

Row 61 Ch2, tr in bl of each st to end, turn.

Row 62 Ch2, tr2tog first 2 sts, tr in each st until last 2 sts, tr2tog, turn. [118 sts]

Rows 63-119 Repeat Row 62. [4 sts]

Row 120 Ch2, (tr2tog) twice. [2 sts]

Fasten off.

BAUBLES (MAKE 19)

Use any colours except Chocolate Lime and Sunflower.

Make a magic loop.

Round 1 Ch2, 14tr into loop, ss to first tr. [14 sts]

Round 2 Ch2, 2tr in each st around, ss to first tr. [28 sts]

Round 3 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), dc in each st around, ss to first dc. [28 sts]

Fasten off.

Join Sunflower to any st.

Row 4 (RS) Ch1, 5dc, turn leaving rem sts unworked. [5 sts]

Row 5 (WS) Ch1, dc2tog, dc, dc2tog, turn. [3 sts]

Row 6 Ch6, ss in last st.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

STAR (MAKE 2)

Using Sunflower, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch2, 15tr into loop, ss to first tr. [15 sts]

Round 2 (Ch6, ss in second ch from hook, dc in next ch, htr in next ch, tr in next ch, dtr in next ch, skip 2 sts from Round 1, ss in next st) 5 times.

Fasten off first Star only.

Place Stars together with RS facing out, work next round through both pieces to join.

Round 3 Ss in each st around, lightly stuff as you join, ss in beg st.

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Refer to the images as a guide.

Using Sunflower, surface crochet between Rows 10-11, joining Bauble through the ch-6 sp at centre st.

Surface crochet between Rows 20-21, joining 3 Baubles evenly across.

Surface crochet between Rows 40-41, joining 5 Baubles evenly across.

Fold Cushion in half across Row 61, dc evenly around side edges to join, stuffing as you go. Sew the Star to the top of the Cushion.

Weave in all rem ends.

Hats measure approx 9cm (3¾in) tall
Scarves measure approx 65cm (25½in) long

NOTES

Hats are worked in rounds from the brim up. Parts of this pattern are worked using the amigurumi method. Work stitches continuously in a spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as you work.

BOTTLE HATS AND SCARVES

STAR HAT

BRIM

Using Marshmallow, ch30 and ss in last ch from hook (being careful not to twist the ch).

Round 1 (RS) Ch3 (counts as tr throughout), tr in each ch around, ss to top of beg ch-3. [30 sts]

Rounds 2-4 (RS) Ch2 (counts as BPtr), (FPtr around next st, BPtr around next st) rep around to end, ss to top of beg ch-2.

Fasten off.

MAIN SECTION

Join Blueberry Bonbon in any st.

Round 5 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), dc in each st around. [30 sts]

Rounds 6-10 (RS) Dc in each st around.

Round 11 (Dc2tog, pm in dec, dc in next 13 sts) twice. [28 sts]

Move markers up as you work.



Round 12 Dc in each st around.

Round 13 Dc2tog, dc in each st to marker, dc2tog, dc in each st to end. [26 sts]

Rounds 14-33 Rep Rounds 12-13. [6 sts]

Fasten off.

Thread tail through fl of final 6 sts and pull tight to close. Sew pompom to top of Hat.

Using Sunflower and the image as a guide, embroider details to the front of the Hat.

RED STRIPED HAT

Work Brim as Star Hat.

Work Main Section as Star Hat, working in colour sequence: 4 rows in Rouge, 4 rows in Marshmallow.

TREE HAT

Work Brim as Star Hat.

Work Main Section as Star Hat, using Chocolate Lime and working in bl only throughout.

TREE DECORATIONS

Use the images as a guide for all decorations. With top of Tree Hat facing you, join Chocolate Lime in any unused fl from Round 5.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3 (counts as dc, ch2), (dc, ch2) in each fl around Round 5, ss to first ch of beg ch-3.

Fasten off.

Rep Round 1 on unused fl on Round 15 and Round 25.

Using Tumeric, embroider chain stitch around and up the Hat.

Using Candy Floss, embroider straight vertical sts.

BLUE GRANNY SCARF

MOTIF (MAKE 11)

Using Sunflower, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3 (counts as tr throughout), 2tr in loop, ch2, (3tr in loop, ch2) 3 times, ss to top of beg ch-3. [12 sts]

Fasten off.

Join Blueberry Bonbon in any ch-2 sp.

Round 2 Ch3, (2tr, ch2, 3tr) in same sp, (3tr, ch2, 3tr) in each ch-sp around, ss to top of beg ch-3. [24 sts]

Fasten off.

Sew Motifs together into a long strip.

Using Blueberry Bonbon, work a round of dc around edge of Scarf.

Gather the short edges of the Scarf and sew a pompom in place at each end.

RED SCARF

Using Marshmallow, ch11.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch across, turn.

Rows 2-13 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn. Change to Rouge.

Row 14 Ch1, (dc in next st, tr in next st) 5 times, turn.

Row 15 Ch1, (dc in tr, tr in dc) 5 times, turn.

Rep Row 15 until Scarf measures 60cm.
Change to Marshmallow.

Next row Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.
Rep last row another 12 times.

Fasten off.

Gather the short edges of the Scarf and sew a pompom in place at each end.

STRIPED SCARF

Using Chocolate Lime, ch11.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch across, turn.

Row 2 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.
Change to Marshmallow.

Rep Row 2 until Scarf measures approx 65cm, working in the following colour sequence: 2 rows in Marshmallow, 2 rows in Candy Floss, 2 rows in Marshmallow, 2 row in Tumeric, 2 rows in Marshmallow, 2 rows in Chocolate Lime; rep from * ending on a Chocolate Lime rep.

Fasten off.

Gather the short edges of the Scarf and sew a pompom in place at each end.

MEASUREMENTS

Jumpers measures approx 8x5cm (3¼x2in)

NOTES

Parts of this pattern are worked using the amigurumi method. Work stitches continuously in a spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as you work.

You can use any colours for any rounds of the Jumpers.

JUMPER BUNTING

STRIPED JUMPER (MAKE 5)

Striped Jumpers use 3 colours, referred to as Yarns A-C in pattern.

Using Yarn A, ch16 and ss in last ch from hook.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), dc in each ch to end. [16 sts]

Round 2 (1dc, 2dc in next st) 8 times. [24 sts]

Change to Yarn B.

Round 3 (2dc in next st, 2dc) 8 times. [32 sts]

Round 4 (3dc, 2dc in next st) 8 times. [40 sts]
Change to Yarn C and cont changing between Yarns B and C every 2 rounds until otherwise stated.

Round 5 (2dc, 2dc in next st, 2dc) 8 times. [48 sts]

Round 6 6dc, skip 12 sts, 12dc, skip 12 sts, 6dc. [24 sts]

Rounds 7-12 Dc in each st around. [24 sts]

Change to Yarn A.

Rounds 13-14 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off.

SLEEVES (MAKE 2)

Join Yarn C in any skipped st from Round 6.

Round 1 Ch1, dc in each st around, ss to beg dc. [12 sts]

Change to Yarn B.

Round 2 Ch1, dc in each st around.

Round 3 Dc in each st around.

Change to Yarn C.

Rounds 4-5 As Round 3.

Change to Yarn A.

Rounds 6-7 As Round 3.

Fasten off.

EMBROIDERED JUMPER

Embroidered Jumpers use 2 colours, referred to as Yarns A and B in pattern.

Work as Striped Jumper, using Yarn B for all Yarn B and C rounds in Striped pattern.

Fasten off.

Using any colour, embroider a snowflake on the Jumper.

TO MAKE UP

Alternate Striped Jumpers and Embroidered Jumpers, sew together at ends of sleeve with a small st.

GRANNY TREE SKIRT

Put your favourite motif into use on a practical table-top tree skirt pattern from designer Kelly Wilson Moore

- West Yorkshire Spinners Signature 4ply (75% wool, 25% nylon, 100g/400m), 2 balls of Chocolate Lime (0395), 1 ball of each: Tumeric (358), Sunflower (1001), Blueberry Bonbon (365), Marshmallow (011), Rouge (1000), Candy Floss (547), Poppy Seed (0600)

- A 3.5mm (US E/4) hook

TENSION

25 sts and 12 rows measure 10x10cm (4x4in) over treble crochet using a 3.5mm hook, or size needed to obtain correct tension

MEASUREMENTS

Tree Skirt measures 68cm (27in) deep



NOTES

Tree Skirt is made up of 8 Panels, which are joined together, leaving one side open to attach around the tree.

There is a construction Diagram on page 79, which you will need to refer to when making up the Panels.

TREE SKIRT

PANEL (MAKE 8)

GRANNY SQUARES (MAKE 6 PER PANEL)

Use any colour for any round.

Make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3 (counts as tr throughout), 2tr in loop, (ch2, 3tr in loop) 3 times, ch2, ss to top of ch-3. [12 sts]

Fasten off.

Join next chosen colour to any ch-2 corner sp.

Round 2 Ch3, (2tr, ch2, 3tr) in same sp, (3tr, ch2, 3tr) in each ch-2 sp around, ss to top of ch-3. [24 sts]

Fasten off.

Join next chosen colour to any ch-2 corner sp.

Round 3 Ch3, (2tr, ch2, 3tr) in same sp, *3tr in sp between 3-tr groups, (3tr, ch2, 3tr) in next ch-2 corner sp; rep from * twice more, 3tr in sp between 3-tr groups, ss to top of ch-3. [36 sts]

Fasten off.

Join next chosen colour to any ch-2 corner sp.

Round 4 Ch3, (2tr, ch2, 3tr) in same sp, *(3tr in sp between 3-tr groups) twice, (3tr, ch2, 3tr) in next ch-2 corner sp; rep from * twice more, *(3tr in next sp between 3-tr groups) twice, ss to top of ch-3. [48 sts]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Using Chocolate Lime and the Diagram, dc the Squares together.



EDGING

Join Chocolate Lime in first st across top.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, *dc in each st to corner, (dc, ch2, dc) in corner, dc in each st to inverse corner, htr2tog corner ch-sps; rep from * working increase in corner and decrease in each inverse corner around to end, ss to beg dc. [166 sts]

Fasten off.

PANEL SHAPING

With RS facing, join Chocolate Lime to fourth st down on the left-hand side of top Square (Square A).

Row 1 (RS) Ch1, 4dc, 4htr, 3tr, ss to third st and next 2 sts of Square B, turn. [11 sts]

Row 2 (WS) 4tr, 4htr, 3dc, 1dc into the unworked st before the 1st st of Row 1, ss in next 2 sts, ss in ch-2 corner sp, turn. [12 sts]

Row 3 Ch1, skip 1 st, dc in next st (where ss was worked), 4dc, 4htr, 2tr, 2tr in last st, ss in ch-2 corner sp of Square B. [13 sts]

Fasten off.

Repeat for Squares B and D with RS facing. Then rep for left-hand side edge with Squares A, C and F – working with WS facing.

Fasten off.

BORDER

Join Chocolate Lime to top right-hand ch-2 corner sp.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3, (tr, ch2, 2tr) in ch-2 corner sp, 14tr, *(2tr, ch2, 2tr) in ch-2 corner sp, 45tr**, (2tr, ch2, 2tr) in ch-2 corner sp, 56tr; rep from * to **, ss to top of beg ch-3. [176 sts]

Round 2 Ch3, *tr in each st around to ch-2 sp, (2tr, ch2, 2tr) in ch-2 corner sp, skip next st, rep from * around, ss to top of ch-3. [188 sts]

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Sew the Panels together into a long strip, so the Square As are all lined up along the top edge.

LOWER EDGING

Join Chocolate Lime to first ch-2 corner sp to work across lower edge.

Row 1 (RS) Ch3, *tr in each st to end of 1 panel, tr2tog next 2 ch-2 sps; rep from * to end of row, tr in final ch-2 corner sp, turn. [513 sts]

Change to Marshmallow.

Row 2 (WS) Ch2 (does not count as st), tr in first st, skip 1 st, 3tr in next st, (skip 2 sts, 3tr in next st) rep to final st, 2tr in final st, turn. [513 sts, 170 groups of 3tr]

Change to Rouge.

Row 3 Ch2, tr in first st, 3tr in sp between each 3-tr group, tr in last st, turn. [514 sts]

Change to Chocolate Lime.

Row 4 Ch2, 1tr in first st, 3tr in sp before each 3-tr group, tr in last sp after 3-tr group, tr in last st, turn. [513 sts]

Row 5 Ch1, dc2tog first 2 sts, dc in each st to last 2 sts, dc2tog.

Fasten off.

With RS facing, join Sunflower in first st.

Row 6 (RS) *Ss, skip 2 sts, 8tr in next st, skip 2 sts; rep from * to end, ss in final st.

Fasten off.

UPPER EDGING

Join Chocolate Lime to first ch-2 corner sp to work across upper edge.

Row 1 (WS) Ch1, dc in corner, *dc in each st to end of Panel, dc2tog next 2 ch-2 sps; rep from * to final corner, dc in ch-2 corner sp, turn. [177 sts]

Change to Sunflower.
Row 2 (RS) *Ss, skip 1 st, 4dc in next st, skip 1 st; rep from * to end, ss in final st. [176 sts, 44 groups of 4-dc]

Fasten off and weave in all ends.

TIES

Join Chocolate Lime in top-right corner, ch30.

Fasten off.

Rep on 3 remaining corners.

Cut 5 lengths of Chocolate Lime, 10cm long.

Fold in half and join the the end of each tie with a lark's head knot. Trim to desired length.

GINGERBREAD STOCKING

Our little fellow looks understandably worried to have had a few bites taken out of him! Designed by Marianne Rawlins

■ West Yorkshire Spinners Signature 4ply (75% wool, 25% nylon, 100g/400m), 2 balls of Rouge (1000), 1 ball of each: Tumeric (358), Blueberry Bonbon (365), Chocolate Lime (395), Marshmallow (011), Candy Floss (547)

■ A 4.5mm (US 7) hook

■ A 3mm (US C/2 or D/3) hook

TENSION

Tension is not critical, but it may affect the yarn quantities required

MEASUREMENTS

Stocking measures approx 45cm (17¾in) tall

NOTES

Main Stocking is made up of 2 pieces, which are sewn together.

All other parts are made separately and sewn to the front of the Stocking.

GINGERBREAD STOCKING

STOCKING PANEL (MAKE 2)

Using Marshmallow and a 4.5mm hook, ch41.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch across, turn. [40 sts]

Row 2 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Rows 3-6 Rep Row 2.

Change to Rouge.

Rows 7-53 Rep Row 2.

Row 54 Ch1, dc to last st, 2dc in last st, turn. [41 sts]

Row 55 Ch1, 2dc in first st, dc to last st, turn. [42 sts]

Row 56 Rep Row 54. [43 sts]

Row 57 Ch1, 3dc in first st, dc to final st, turn. [45 sts]

Rows 58-65 Rep Row 54-55. [53 sts]

Row 66 Ch1, dc in every st across.

Row 67 Rep Row 55. [54 sts]

Row 68 Ch1, (dc2tog) twice, dc to final st, turn. [52 sts]

Rows 69-70 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Row 71 Ch1, dc in every st to final 2 sts, turn leaving final 2 sts unworked. [50 sts]

Row 72 Ch1, dc3tog, dc in every st across, turn. [48 sts]

Row 73 Ch1, dc to final 2 sts, turn leaving final 2 sts unworked. [46 sts]

Row 74 Rep Row 72. [44 sts]

Row 75 Ch1, dc to final 4 sts, leave final 4 sts unworked. [40 sts]

Row 76 Rep Row 72. [38 sts]

Row 77 Ch1, dc2tog, dc to final 2 sts, turn leaving final 2 sts unworked. [35 sts]

Row 78 Ch1, dc3tog, dc to final st, turn leaving final st unworked. [32 sts]

Row 79 Ch1, dc to final 2 sts, leave final 2 sts unworked. [30 sts]

Row 80 Ch1, dc3tog, dc to final st, turn leaving final st unworked. [27 sts]

Row 81 Ch1, dc2tog, dc to final 2 sts, turn leaving final 2 sts unworked. [24 sts]

Row 82 Ch1, dc3tog, dc to final st, turn leaving final st unworked. [21 sts]

Row 83 Ch1, dc2tog, dc to final st, turn leaving final st unworked. [19 sts]

Rows 84-86 Rep Row 83. [13 sts]

Work a round of dc evenly around outside edge, working dc in each st and row-end and 2dc in each corner. Use Marshmallow when

working around edge of Rows 1-6.

Fasten off.

GINGERBREAD MAN

BODY AND ARMS

Using Tumeric and a 4.5mm hook, ch9.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in every ch across, turn. [8 sts]

Row 2 Ch1, 3dc in first st, dc in each st to end, turn. [10 sts]

Row 3 Ch1, dc in each st to final st, 3dc in final st, turn. [12 sts]

Row 4 Ch1, 2dc in first st, dc in each st to end, turn. [13 sts]

Row 5 Ch1, 2dc in first st, dc in each st to final st, 2dc in final st, turn. [15 sts]

Row 6 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Rows 7-8 Ch1, dc in each st to final st, 2dc in final st, turn. [17 sts]

Row 9 Ch1, 2dc in first st, dc in each st across, turn. [18 sts]

Row 10 Ch1, dc in each st to final st, 3dc in final st, turn. [21 sts]

Rows 11-12 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Row 13 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in each st across, turn. [20 sts]

Rows 14-15 Rep Row 13. [18 sts]

Row 16 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in every st to final 2 sts, dc2tog, turn. [16 sts]

Row 17 Rep Row 16. [14 sts]

Row 18 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in every st to final st, 3dc in final st, turn. [16 sts]

Row 19 Ch1, 2dc in first st, dc in every st to final st, 4dc in final st, turn. [20 sts]

Row 20 Ch1, dc in first st, dc in each st to final st, 2dc in final st, turn. [21 sts]

Row 21 Ch1, 3dc in first st, dc in each st across, turn. [23 sts]

Row 22 Ch1, dc in each st across to final st, 2dc in final st, turn. [24 sts]

Row 23 Ch1, 2dc in first st, dc in each st across, turn. [25 sts]

Rows 24-29 Rep Rows 22-23. [31 sts]

Rows 30-32 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Rem section of arm is worked over next 5 rows.

Row 33 Ch1, dc in first 9 sts, turn leaving rem sts unworked. [9 sts]

Row 34 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in every st across, turn. [8 sts]

Row 35 Ch1, dc in every st to final st, turn leaving last st unworked. [7 sts]

Row 36 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in every st across to last st, turn leaving last st unworked. [5 sts]

Row 37 Ch1, dc in first 4 sts, leave final st unworked. [4 sts]

Fasten off.

BODY CONTINUED

Rejoin Tumeric in second unworked st from Row 32.

Rows 33-41 Ch1, dc in every st to end, turn. [21 sts]

Row 42 Ch1, dc in every st to final st, turn

leaving final st unworked. [20 sts]

Rows 43-45 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

LEFT LEG

Left leg is worked over next 12 rows.

Row 46 Ch1, dc in first 8 sts, turn leaving final 12 sts unworked. [8 sts]

Row 47 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in each st across, turn. [7 sts]

Row 48 Ch1, dc in each st to final st, turn leaving final st unworked. [6 sts]

Rows 49-50 Rep Rows 47-48. [4 sts]

Row 51 Ch1, dc in every st across, turn.

Row 52 Ch1, dc in each st to final st, turn leaving final st unworked. [3 sts]

Rows 53-54 Rep Rows 51-52. [2 sts]

Row 55 Ch1, dc2tog. [1 st]

Fasten off.

RIGHT LEG

Skip first unworked st from Row 45, join Tumeric in next st.

Row 1 Ch1, dc in next 11 sts, turn. [11 sts]

Row 2 Ch1, dc in every st across, turn.

Row 3 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in each st across, turn. [10 sts]

Rows 4-9 Rep Row 2.

Row 10 Ch1, dc in every st to final st, 2dc in final st, turn. [11 sts]

Row 11 Ch1, dc in every st to final st, turn leaving final st unworked. [10 sts]

Row 12 Ch1, dc in every st across, turn.

Row 13 Ch1, dc in every st to final 2 sts, turn leaving final 2 sts unworked. [8 sts]

Row 14 Ch1, dc in every st to final st, turn leaving final st unworked. [7 sts]

Row 15 Ch1, dc2tog, dc in every st to final 2 sts, turn leaving final 2 sts unworked. [4 sts]

Work a round of dc evenly around edge.

Fasten off.

Using Chocolate Lime and a 3mm hook, sew chain stitch around neck, wrist and ankle.

EYES (MAKE 2)

Using Marshmallow and a 4.5mm hook, make a magic loop.

Round 1 Ch1, 6dc into loop, ss to first st [6 sts]

Round 2 Ch1, 2dc in every st around. [12 sts]

Fasten off.

Sew to the head of the Gingerbread Man.

Using Blueberry Bonbon, embroider the irises.

BUTTONS (MAKE 3)

Using Blueberry Bonbon and a 4.5mm hook, make a magic loop.

Round 1 Ch1, 9dc into loop, ss to first st [9 dc]

Fasten off.

Sew to the body.

MOUTH

Using Rouge and a 3mm hook, ch4.

Round 1 Ch1, dc in second ch from hook, dc in next ch, 3dc in next ch, turn to work across

opposite side of foundation ch, dc in next ch, 2dc in final ch, ss to beg dc. [8 sts]

Round 2 Ch1, (dc in next 3 sts, 3dc in next st) twice, ss to beg dc. [12 sts]

Change to Marshmallow.

Round 3 Ch1, (dc in next 4 sts, 3dc in next st, dc in next st) twice, ss to beg dc. [16 sts]

Fasten off.

Sew to the head.

HANGING LOOP

Using Candy Floss and a 4.5mm hook, ch5.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each st across, turn. [4 sts]

Rows 2-16 Ch1, dc in each st across, turn.

Fasten off.

CRUMBS (MAKE 2)

Using Tumeric and a 4.5mm hook, ch7.

Row 1 Ch1, dc in every st across, turn. [6 sts]

Row 2 Ch1, dc2tog, 2dc, dc2tog, turn. [4 sts]

Row 3 Ch1, (dc2tog) twice, turn. [2 sts]

Row 4 Ch1, dc2tog. [1 st]

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Use the images as a guide when making up.

With WS facing, sew the 2 Stocking Panels together.

Sew the Gingerbread Man to the Stocking.

Sew the Hanging Loop to the top-right corner, slightly inside the top.

Sew the Crumbs to the side of the Head.

Weave in all ends.

If you are making this toy for a child under 36 months, do not use safety eyes; instead, embroider eyes with stranded cotton.

Using Lime, make a magic loop.

- Round 1 (RS)** Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 dc]
- Round 2** 2dc in each st around. [12 dc]
- Round 3** (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [18 dc]
- Round 4** (Dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [24 dc]
- Round 5** (Dc in next 3 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [30 dc]
- Round 6** (Dc in next 4 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [36 dc]
- Round 7** (Dc in next 5 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [42 dc]
- Round 8** (Dc in next 6 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [48 dc]
- Round 9** (Working in bl only) Dc in each st around.
- Rounds 10-14** Dc in each st around.
- Round 15** (Working in bl only) (Dc in next 6 sts, dc2tog) 6 times. [42 dc]
Pm in first unworked fl from Round 14.
- Rounds 16-19** Dc in each st around.
- Round 20** (Dc in next 5 sts, dc2tog) 6 times. [36 dc]
- Round 21** (Working in bl only) Dc in each st around.
Pm in first unworked fl from Round 20.
- Rounds 22-24** Dc in each st around.
- Round 25** (Dc in next 4 sts, dc2tog) 6 times. [30 dc]
- Round 26** Dc in each st around.
- Round 27** (Working in bl only) Dc in each st around.
Pm in first unworked fl from Round 26.
- Rounds 28-30** Dc in each st around.
- Round 31** (Dc in next 3 sts, dc2tog) 6 times. [24 dc]
- Round 32** Dc in each st around.
Stuff Body firmly as you work.
- Round 33** (Working in bl only) (Dc in next 2 sts, dc2tog) 6 times. [18 dc]
Pm in first unworked fl from Round 32.
- Round 34** Dc in each st around.
Fasten off, leaving a long tail.



The baubles have a tiny amount of stuffing in them to give the perfect round shape

TREE BOUGHS

Join Lime to marked fl on Round 14.

- Round 1** (Dc in next 7 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [54 dc]
- Round 2** Dc in each st around.
- Round 3** (Dc in next 8 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [60 dc]
- Round 4** *(Dc, htr) in next st, tr in next st, dtr in next st, tr in next st, (htr, dc) in next st, ss in next st; rep from * 9 times more. [10 patt reps]
- Round 5** Dc in each st around. [80 dc]
Fasten off and weave in ends.

Join Lime to the marked fl on Round 20.

- Round 6** (Dc in next 5 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [42 dc]
- Round 7** Dc in each st around.
- Round 8** (Dc in next 6 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [48 dc]
- Round 9** *(Dc, htr) in next st, tr in next st, dtr in next st, tr in next st, (htr, dc) in next st, ss in next st; rep from * 7 times more. [8 patt reps]
- Round 10** Dc in each st around. [64 dc]
Fasten off and weave in ends.

Join Lime to the marked fl on Round 26.

- Round 11** (Dc in next 4 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [36 dc]
- Round 12** Dc in each st around.
- Round 13** (Dc in next 5 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [42 dc]
- Round 14** *(Dc, htr) in next st, tr in next st, dtr in next st, tr in next st, (htr, dc) in next st, ss in next st; rep from * 6 times more. [7 patt reps]
- Round 15** Dc in each st around. [56 dc]
Fasten off and weave in ends.

Join Lime to the marked fl on Round 32.

- Round 16** (Dc in next 3 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [30 dc]
- Round 17** Dc in each st around.
- Round 18** (Dc in next 4 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [36 dc]
- Round 19** *(Dc, htr) in next st, tr in next st, dtr in next st, tr in next st, (htr, dc) in next st, ss in next st; rep from * 5 times more. [6 patt reps]
- Round 20** Dc in each st around. [48 dc]
Fasten off and weave in ends.

AMIGURUMI TREE

HEAD

Using Avocado, make a magic loop.

Rounds 1-7 (RS) As Rounds 1-7 of Body. [42 dc]

Rounds 8-18 Dc in each st around.

Insert safety eyes between Rounds 13-14,

approx 12 sts apart.

Stuff as you go.

Change to Lime.

Round 19 Dc in each st around.

Rounds 20-38 Rep Rounds 16-34 of Body.

Round 39 (Dc in next sts, dc2tog) 6 times.

[12 dc]

Round 40 Dc in each st around.

Round 41 (Dc2tog) 6 times. [6 dc]

Fasten off.

Thread tail through fl of final 6 sts and pull tight to close.

Using black stranded cotton, embroider the eye details using the image as a guide.

HEAD BOUGHS

Work Rounds 6-20 of Tree Boughs on corresponding rounds of Head.

Sew the Head to the Body.

BAUBLES (MAKE 24)

Make 8 each in Neon Pink, Surf and Neon Yellow.

Make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 dc]

Rounds 2-3 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Push a tiny bit of stuffing inside the Bauble.

Using a sewing needle, thread the tail through the fl of final 6 sts and pull tight to close.

Using the image as a guide, sew the Baubles to the Boughs.

STAR

Using Neon Yellow, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 10htr into loop, ss to first htr.

[10 htr]

Round 2 Ch1, *(htr, tr, ch2, tr, htr) in next st, dc

in next st) 5 times, ss to beg htr.

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Sew to the top of the Head.

LEGS (MAKE 2)

Using Avocado, ch7.

Round 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in next 4 ch, 3dc in the last ch, turn to work down opposite side of foundation ch, dc in next 4 sts, 2dc in last ch. [14 dc]

Round 2 2dc in next st, dc in next 4 sts, 2dc in next 3 sts, dc in next 4, 2dc in next 2 sts. [20 dc]

Round 3 2dc in next 2 sts, dc in next 6 sts, (2dc in next st, dc in next st) twice, 2dc in next st, dc in next 4 sts, 2dc in next st, dc in next sts, 2dc in last st. [27 dc]

Round 4 Dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st, dc in next 6 sts, (2dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts) 3 times, 2dc in next st, dc in next 5 sts, 2dc in next st, dc in next 2 sts. [33 dc]

Rounds 5-6 Dc in each st around.

Round 7 Dc in next 10 sts, (dc2tog) 7 times, dc in next 9 sts. [26 dc]

Round 8 Dc in next 8 sts, (dc2tog) 5 times, dc in next 8 sts. [21 dc]

Round 9 Dc in next 6 sts, (dc2tog) 5 times, dc in next 5 sts. [16 dc]

Round 10 Dc in next 4 sts, (dc2tog) 4 times, dc in next 4 sts. [12 dc]

Stuff as you go.

Rounds 11-15 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off.

Sew the Legs over Rounds 11-13 of the Body.

ARMS (MAKE 2)

Using Avocado, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 dc]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [12 dc]

Rounds 3-5 Dc in each st around.

Round 6 Dc in next 4 sts, (dc2tog) twice, dc in next 4 sts. [10 dc]

Round 7 Dc in next 4 sts, dc2tog, dc in next 4 st. [9 dc]



Take your time to add the facial details, as these are what really brings the doll to life

Stuff as you go.

Rounds 8-14 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off.

Sew the top of the Arm closed and sew to the Body.

BOW

Using Neon Pink, ch12

Round 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch to end, turn. [11 dc]

Rounds 2-6 Ch1, dc in each st to end, turn.

Fasten off.

Fold the bow lengthways. Take a length of Neon Pink and wind it around the centre. Secure with a couple of stitches, then unfold edges to form the Bow shape.

TIE

Using Neon Pink, ch24

Round 1 Htr in third ch from hook, htr in each ch to end. [22 htr]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Fold the piece into a v-shape. Sew the pointed fold to the back of the Bow, then sew to the doll just beneath the Head.

Weave in all ends.

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO MAKE A DOUBLE TREBLE



1 Yrh twice and insert the hook under the top 2 loops of the stitch indicated. Yrh and draw through the stitch only (4 loops on hook).



2 Yrh and pull the yarn through the first 2 loops only (3 loops on hook).



3 Yrh and pull the yarn through the first 2 loops only (2 loops on hook).



4 Yrh and pull the yarn through the remaining 2 loops. There's your double treble made and you'll have 1 loop left on your hook ready to do the next stitch.

 - Cherryade (754)
 - Fizz (779)
- A 3mm (US C/2 or D/3) hook
- 2 A4 corrugated cardboard sheets
- An LED tea light

TENSION

25 sts and 25 rows measure 10x10cm (4x4in) over pattern using a 3mm hook, or size needed to obtain correct tension

MEASUREMENTS

House measures approx 8.5x8.5x13cm (3¼x3¼x5in)

ABBREVIATIONS

Make tile Work 3htr around post of htr in previous row from top to bottom, then 3htr around post of adjacent htr from bottom to top
For a full list, see page 130

Gingerbread houses have become a big thing in the past few years, and this one will be much longer-lasting than most!

NOTES

House is made up of 6 Panels: a Base, 2 Sides, a Front and 2 Roof pieces. Each Panel is made up of an interior and exterior, which are sewn around cardboard for stability.

Cut the following shapes out of your cardboard: Base 8x8cm, 2 Sides 8x8cm with a 6x6cm hole cut in centre, 2 Roofs 6.5x8cm, Front Pentagon 8cm across bottom, 8cm up Sides, with the top 2 edges reaching the centre point at 13cm from base and a 6x6cm hole cut in centre of square as for Sides.

GINGERBREAD TEALIGHT HOUSE BASE (MAKE 2)

Make 1 in Dolly for interior, and 1 in Puff for exterior.

Ch22.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, (ch1, skip 1 ch, dc in next ch) 10 times, turn. [21 sts]

Row 2 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), dc in first st, (dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc) 9 times, dc in ch-sp, dc in last st turn.

Row 3 Ch1, dc in first st, (ch1, skip dc, dc in ch-sp) 9 times, ch1, skip dc, dc in last st, turn.

Rows 4-21 Rep Rows 2-3. Do not turn at end of Row 21.

Round 22 Ss evenly around, working 21ss around each edge

Fasten off and weave in ends.

SIDES (MAKE 4)

Make 2 in Dolly for interiors, and 2 in Puff for exteriors.

Rows 1-5 As Rows 1-5 of Base.

Work is split into two sections to form a window frame.

Row 6 (WS) Ch1, dc in first st, dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc, dc in ch-sp, dc in next dc, turn leaving rem sts unworked. [5 sts]

Row 7 (RS) Ch1, dc in first st, ch1, skip dc, dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc, dc in final dc, turn.

Rows 8-16 Rep Rows 6-7, ending on a Row 6 rep. **Fasten off.**

Rejoin yarn in fifth st from end of Row 5 and rep Rows 6-16.

With RS facing, rejoin yarn in first st Row 16 on second section.

Row 17 Ch1, dc in first st, ch1, skip dc, dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc, dc in last st, ch11, dc in first st on next section, ch1, skip dc, dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc, dc in last st, turn.

Row 18 Ch1, dc in first st, dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc, dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc, (dc in next ch, skip 1 ch, ch1) 5 times, dc in last ch, ch1, skip next dc, dc in next ch-sp, ch1, skip dc, dc in last ch-sp, dc in last st, turn.

Row 19 Ch1, dc in first st, (ch1, skip dc, dc in ch-sp) 9 times, ch1, skip dc, dc in last st, turn.



The wreath, made in double crochet, is trimmed with a red running stitch and bow

Row 20 Ch1, dc in first st, (dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc) 9 times, dc in ch-sp, dc in last st turn.

Row 21 As Row 19, do not turn.

Round 22 Ss evenly around, working 21ss around each edge

Fasten off and weave in ends.

FRONT (MAKE 2)

Make 1 in Dolly for interior, and 1 in Puff for exterior.

Rows 1-21 As Rows 1-21 of Sides.

Row 22 Ch1, dc2tog first dc and ch-sp, (ch1, skip next dc, dc in ch-sp) rep to final ch-sp, dc2tog ch-sp and last dc, turn. [19 sts]

Rows 23-29 As Row 22. [5 sts]

Row 30 Ch1, dc2tog first st and ch-sp, ch1, skip dc, dc2tog ch-sp and last st, turn. [3 sts]

Row 31 Ch1, dc3tog, do not turn.

Round 32 Ss evenly around, working 15ss across sloped edges and 21ss across each Side edge.

Fasten off.

Ss evenly around window frame.

ROOF INTERIOR (MAKE 2)

Using Dolly, ch22.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, (ch1, skip 1 ch, dc in next ch) 10 times, turn. [21 sts]

Row 2 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), dc in first st, (dc in ch-sp, ch1, skip dc) 9 times, dc in ch-sp, dc in last st turn.

Row 3 Ch1, dc in first st, (ch1, skip dc, dc in ch-sp) 9 times, ch1, skip dc, dc in last st, turn. Rep Rows 2-3 until piece measures 6.5cm.

Next round Ss evenly around, working 21ss across each long edge and 15ss across each short edge.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

ROOF EXTERIOR (MAKE 2)

Using Pebble, ch23.

Row 1 Htr in third ch from hook, ch2, skip 3 ch,

GINGERBREAD HOUSE

(2htr in next ch, ch2, skip 3 ch) 4 times, 2htr in last ch, turn. [6 2-htr groups]

Row 2 (Make tile around 2-htr, skip next 2-htr) twice, make tile around 2-htr, ss in between last 2-htr, turn. [3 tiles]

Row 3 Ch2, htr in same space, (ch2, 2htr in sp between 2-htr from 2 rows below) 5 times, turn. [6 pairs of htr]

Row 4 (Skip 2-htr, make tile around next 2-htr) 3 times. [3 tiles]

Row 5 Ch2, htr in same space, (ch2, 2htr in sp between 2-htr from 2 rows below) 5 times, turn. [6 pairs of htr]

Row 6 (Make tile around 2-htr, skip next 2-htr) twice, make tile around 2-htr, ss in between last 2-htr, turn. [3 tiles]

Rep Rows 3-6 until piece measures 6cm.

Work next row into sts 2 rows below.

Next row (RS) Ch1, *2dc in sp between 2-htr, 2dc in ch-2 sp: rep from * across to end, do not turn. [22 sts]

Next round Ss evenly around, working 22ss across each long edge and 15ss across each short edge.

Fasten off, weave in ends.

WREATH

Using Fizz, ch12 and ss to the first st to form a loop.

Round 1 Ch1, 2dc in each ch around, ss to beg dc. [24 sts]

Round 2 Ch1, (3dc in next st, ss in next st) 12 times, ss to beg dc. [36 sts]

Fasten off, weave in ends.

Using a length of Cherryade and a tapestry needle, sew a running stitch of red around the wreath and tie the 2 ends to create a bow.

CANDY CANES (MAKE 2)

Candy Cane is made up of 2 pieces. Make 1 each in Dolly and Cherryade. Ch22.

Row 1 3dc in second ch from hook, 3dc in each

ch to end. [63 sts]

Fasten off.

To create 1 candy cane, twist a Dolly and Cherryade curl together until they completely interlock.

WINDOWSILL

Using Cherryade, ch3.

Row 1 Insert hook in second ch from hook, yrh and pull up loop, leave loop on hook, insert hook in next ch, yrh and pull up loop, leave loop on hook (3 loops on hook).

Row 2 Remove last 2 loops from hook (you can place them on a marker to prevent them coming undone), change to Dolly, yrh and pull through loop on hook, place first loop from marker on hook, yrh and pull through loop (2 loops on hook), place final loop on hook, yrh and pull through loop (3 loops on hook).

Row 3 As Row 2 using Cherryade.

Rows 4-9 Rep Rows 2-3 another 3 times.

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Use the images as a guide when making up.

For each of the 6 cardboard panels, sandwich the interior and exterior piece (with RS facing out). Using the same colour as used for exterior, mattress stitch the pieces together, enclosing the cardboard.

For the Sides and Front, you will also need to sew around the window frames.

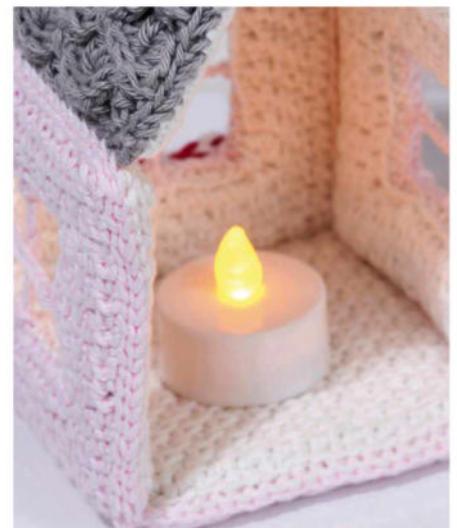
For the window panes on Sides and Front, using same colour as exterior, join yarn to centre of top, ch8, ss in centre of bottom. Rep on sides.

Sew the Sides of each piece together to form the 3D house shape, with an open back. Ensure that the tiles on the Roof pieces are the right way up on both Sides.

Sew the Wreath above the front window, the Windowsill below the Front window and the Candy Canes on the side of the Front.



Make sweet candy canes by working strands in red and white and twisting them together



Use an LED tea light to illuminate your finished crochet house (remember: no naked flames!)

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WORK A MATTRESS STITCH SEAM

1 Lay the pieces out flat with RS facing up. Line up the edges you want to join, matching up each crochet stitch or row-end carefully. It's best to work the mattress stitch seam vertically from bottom to top, so start at the bottom. Thread the needle with yarn and insert it into the right-hand piece, from back to front, 1 stitch up from its bottom edge and 1 stitch in from its left edge.

2 Insert needle into the front of the left-hand piece in the same position, 1 stitch up from the bottom edge and 1 stitch in from the right edge. Continue working the seam 1 stitch in from the edges that you're joining, as follows: bring needle up from back to front on left-hand piece, 1 stitch up (2 stitches up from bottom edge). Insert needle into front of right-hand piece, into the hole you started from.

3 *Bring needle up from back to front on right-hand piece, 1 stitch up. Insert needle into front of left-hand piece in same position. Bring needle up from back to front on left-hand piece, 1 stitch up. Insert needle into front of right-hand piece, into the hole you started from at *. Repeat from *, pulling yarn tight every few stitches to pull the fabric pieces together. Fasten off securely.

You know those handmade decorations that come out each Christmas, and are treasured by everyone in the family? If making your heirloom set of decorations is on your list this year, this pattern is just what you need.

NOTES

Baubles are made up of two Circles. Circles are worked in rounds with RS facing throughout. Each Bauble uses three colours, referred to as Yarns A-C. You can use any three colours, or refer to the image as a guide.

BAUBLE

CIRCLES

Using Yarn A, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch3 (counts as tr throughout), 11tr in loop, ss to top of beg ch-3. [12 sts]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn B in sp between any 2 sts.

Round 2 (RS) Ch2 (counts as first leg of cl), 3-tr cl in same sp, ch2, (4-tr cl in next sp, ch2) 11 times, ss to top of beg cl. [12 sts, 12 ch-2 sps]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn C in any ch-2 sp.

Round 3 Ch3, tr in same sp, tr2tog current ch-sp and next ch-sp, (2tr in same ch-sp as last leg of tr2tog, tr2tog same ch-sp and next ch-sp) 11 times, ss to top of beg ch-3. [36 sts]

Round 4 Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), (htr in next 8 sts, 2htr in next st) 4 times, ss to beg htr. [40 sts]

Fasten off.

TO MAKE UP

Place Circles together with RS facing out. Work next round through both Circles to join.

Join Yarn A in any st.

Round 5 Ch1, dc in each st around (stuffing before closing), ss to beg dc. [40 sts]

Fasten off.

Join Yarn B in any st.

Round 6 (Ch3, tr in st at base of ch-3, skip 1 st,



You can change up the shades you use to suit your own colour scheme



Finish each bauble with a length of string or twine – sparkly is always a great option, too!

ss in next st) 20 times.

Fasten off.

Secure a length of string to the Bauble to make a hanging loop.

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO WORK A CLUSTER STITCH (3-TR CLUSTER)



1 Start a treble in the usual way: yrh, insert hook, yrh, pull loop through (3 loops on hook), yrh, pull through first 2 loops (2 loops on hook). Stop here, without finishing.



2 Start treble in the same st/sp: yrh, insert hook in the same st/sp again, yrh, pull loop through (4 loops on hook), yrh and pull through first 2 loops (3 loops on hook). Stop here.



3 Repeat step 2 until you've worked the number of trebles shown in pattern; in this example we're working 3-tr cl. Next finish all trebles together: yrh, pull loop through all loops on hook.



4 This is how the completed cluster should look. On the next row, just work a stitch into the top of the cluster as usual. The stitch count should remain the same.

NOTES

Hats are made in a single piece. Join Hats in to 2 strands and finish with a pompom.

HAPPY NEW YEAR BUNTING PARTY HATS (MAKE 15)

Using any colour, ch14.

Row 1 (RS) Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch across, turn. [13 sts]

Row 2 (WS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), (1dc, 4-tr cl) 6 times, 1dc, turn.

Row 3 Ch1, dc in each st to end. Change to next colour.

Row 4 Ch1, dc in each st up to final 2 sts, dc2tog, turn. [12 sts]

Rows 5-14 As Row 4. [2 sts]

Row 15 Ch1, dc2tog.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

TO MAKE UP

Using a pompom maker and any colour, make 15 pompoms and trim to approx 2cm in diameter.

Join Hats together into 2 strands, one with 7 Hats and one with 8 Hats.

To join Hats: ch25, (dc in top of any Hat, ch14) rep until all Hats in Strand are joined, ch11.

Fasten off.

Sew a pompom to the top of each Hat.

TO FINISH

Using the image as a guide, secure the letters to the Hats, to spell Happy on the 7-Hat strand and New Year on the 8-Hat strand.



We've used letters with adhesive backs – an option is to sew or glue felt letters to the hats



Start the hats at the bottom by working the textured brims in four-treble clusters

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO DECREASE IN DOUBLE CROCHET (DC2TOG)



1 Start by inserting the hook under the top 2 loops of the next stitch on the previous row. Begin to work a double crochet stitch in the usual way, working yrh and pull loop through (2 loops on hook).



2 Without finishing the first dc, begin the next dc by inserting the hook in the next stitch on the previous row. Again, work yrh and pull loop through (3 loops on hook).



3 Now complete both dc stitches together by working yrh and pull this loop through all 3 loops on the hook.



4 This is how the completed dc2tog should look. You will have neatly decreased by 1 stitch. On subsequent rows, you can simply work a stitch into the top of the dc2tog stitch as usual.

SKATING BUNNY



YOU WILL NEED

- Any DK weight yarn in:
 - cream
 - light blue
 - white
 - silver
- A 2.5mm (US B/1 or C/2) hook
- Toy filling
- 2 safety eyes, 5mm
- Black stranded cotton
- Red or pink colouring pencil

TENSION

Tension is not critical, but it may affect the yarn quantities required

MEASUREMENTS

Bunny measures approx 18cm (7in) tall

ABBREVIATIONS

For a full list, see page 130

This little bunny can't wait to skate into your home this Christmas. Take your time with the facial features for the best results.

NOTES

Bunny is made up of separate parts, which are sewn together. Refer to the images when joining parts together. Parts of this pattern are worked using the amigurumi method. Work stitches continuously in a spiral without closing off each round with a slip stitch. It may help to use a stitch marker in the first stitch of each round, moving it up as you work. If you are making this as a toy for a child under 36 months, do not use safety eyes; instead, embroider eyes using black stranded cotton.

SKATING BUNNY

BODY

Using cream, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1 (does not count as st throughout), 6dc into loop. [6 dc]

Round 2 (RS) 2dc in each st around. [12 dc]

Round 3 (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [18 dc]

Round 4 (Dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [24 dc]

Rounds 5-7 Dc in each st around.

Round 8 (Dc in next 2 sts, dc2tog) 6 times. [18 dc]

Rounds 9-10 Dc in each st around.

Round 11 (Dc in next st, dc2tog) 6 times. [12 dc]

Round 12 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off.

Stuff Body firmly.

HEAD

Using cream, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 5dc into loop. [5 dc]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [10 dc]

Round 3 (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) 5 times. [15 dc]

Round 4 (Dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st) 5 times. [20 dc]

Round 5 (Dc in next 3 sts, 2dc in next st) 5 times. [25 dc]

Rounds 6-8 Dc in each st around.

Change to light blue.

Round 9 (Working in bl only) dc in each st around.

Round 10 Dc in each st around.

Round 11 (Dc in next 3 sts, dc2tog) 5 times. [20 dc]

Insert safety eyes between Rounds 6-7, approx 6 sts apart.

Stuff Head firmly as you go.

Round 12 (Dc in next 2 sts, dc2tog) 5 times. [15 dc]

Round 13 (Dc in next st, dc2tog) 5 times. [10 dc]

Round 14 (Dc2tog) 5 times. [5 dc]

Fasten off.

Thread tail through fl of final 5 sts and pull tight to close.



Embroider a nose, mouth and eyebrows, then lightly colour in the cheeks using a red pencil

Join white to unused fl at back of Round 8.

Round 15 Ch1, dc in each st around, ss to beg dc.

Fasten off and weave in ends.

SHAPE EYES

Thread a strand of cream onto a darning needle, pass needle through the back of the Head and pull through just above one eye.

Work a small horizontal stitch, pass the needle through and out above the second eye and work another small horizontal stitch. Pass needle back below the first eye and work a small horizontal stitch, pass the needle below the second eye and work a final horizontal st. Pass the needle out from the back of the Head and pull until the eyes sink in slightly.

Weave in end.

Using 3 strands of black stranded cotton, embroider the eyebrows.

MUZZLE

Using white, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 dc]

Round 2 (3dc in next st, 2dc in next st, dc in next st) twice. [12 dc]

Round 3 Dc in next st, 2dc in next 3 sts, dc in next 3 sts, 2dc in next 3 sts, dc in last 2 sts. [18 dc]

Fasten off, leaving a long tail.

Sew Muzzle to the Head, just below the eyes. Using light blue, embroider a triangle for the nose.

Using 3 strands of black stranded cotton, embroider the mouth.

Using the side of a red colouring pencil, gently shade the cheeks just below the eyes.

Sew Head to Body.

HAT BOBBLE

Using white, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 dc]

Round 2 (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) 3 times. [9 dc]

Round 3 Dc in each st around.

Lightly stuff as you go.

SKATING BUNNY

Round 4 (Dc in next st, dc2tog) 3 times. [6 dc]

Fasten off.

Thread tail through fl of final 6 sts and pull tight to close.

Sew to the top of the Head.

EARS (MAKE 2)

Using cream, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 dc]

Round 2 (Dc in next 2 sts, 2dc in next st) twice. [8 dc]

Rounds 3-4 Dc in each st around.

Round 5 (Dc in next 3 sts, 2dc in next st) twice. [10 dc]

Rounds 6-11 Dc in each st around.

Round 12 (Dc2tog) 5 times. [5 dc]

Fasten off.

Flatten and pinch final round to form shape shown in image. Secure with a few small sts.

Pin Ears to Head between Rounds 10-11. Once you are happy with the position, sew in place.

LEGS (MAKE 2)

Using light blue, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 dc]

Round 2 2dc in each st around. [12 dc]

Round 3 (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) 6 times. [18 dc]

Round 4 Dc in each st around.

Round 5 Dc in next 3 sts, (dc2tog) 6 times, dc in rem 3 sts. [12 dc]

Round 6 Dc in next 2 sts, (dc2tog) 4 times, dc in rem 2 sts. [8 dc]

Change to cream.

Round 7 (Working in bl only) dc in each st around.

Rounds 8-11 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off.

Stuff Leg firmly.

Join white to any unused fl from Round 6.

Round 12 Ch1, dc in each st around, ss to beg dc. [8 sts]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

ICE SKATE BLADES (MAKE 2)

Using silver grey, ch9.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch to end, turn. [8 dc]

Row 2 Ch, dc in each st to end, turn.

Fold the piece in half so that the sts of Row 2 line up with the foundation ch. Work next row across both edges to join.

Row 3 Ch1, (dc in next 3 sts, ch3, ss in second ch from hook, ss in next ch) twice, dc in rem 2 sts.

Fasten off.

Sew the ch-3 lengths to the bottom of the Legs, making sure the blades are pointing forward.

Sew one Leg to the bottom of the Body, so that it is pointing downwards.

Sew the other Leg to the bottom of the bunny's back, between Rounds 3-5, so that it is pointing behind.

ARMS (MAKE 2)

Using cream, make a magic loop.

Round 1 (RS) Ch1, 6dc into loop. [6 dc]

Round 2 (Dc in next st, 2dc in next st) twice. [8 dc]

Round 3 Dc in each st around.

Round 4 Dc in next 3 sts, dc2tog, dc in next 3 st. [7 dc]

Round 5 Dc in each st around.

Round 6 Dc in next 5 sts, dc2tog. [6 dc]

Rounds 7-9 Dc in each st around.

Fasten off.

Stuff Arms lightly.

Sew an Arm to the front side of the Body, so that it's pointing forwards. Sew the other Arm to the other side so that it is pointing behind.

SCARF

Using blue, ch31.

Row 1 Dc in second ch from hook, dc in each ch to end. [30 dc]

Fasten off and weave in ends.

Tie Scarf around the neck.



Ears are worked in the round as a tube, then flattened before they are sewn to the head



The blades of the ice skates are strengthened by working a double-layered fabric

SIMPLE STEPS HOW TO USE STITCH MARKERS IN SPIRALS

In this pattern, you'll work the stitches in spiral rounds. If you've never done this before, don't worry, it's easy! At the end of a round, don't join the first and last stitches with a slip stitch. Instead, just work the first stitch of a new round into the top of the first stitch on the previous round. Using stitch markers will help you to keep track of spiral rounds. Our step-by-step guide (right) will show you how to do this.



1 Work the first stitch of a round and place a stitch marker in this first stitch.



2 Work a spiral round of double crochet stitches until you've worked the last stitch of the round. The next stitch you'll want to work into will have the stitch marker in it.



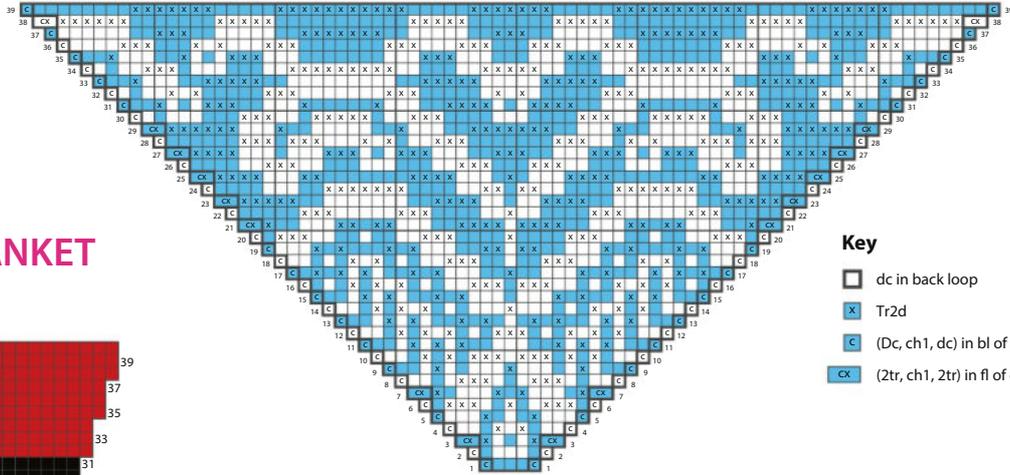
3 You'll need to remove the marker, work the first stitch of the new round and then replace the stitch marker in this first stitch, to mark the start of the round again.

Crochet essentials

Over the next few pages, you'll find simple step-by-step guides to many useful stitches and techniques that you'll use every time you pick up a hook

HOLDING THE HOOK

Try these methods and see which works best



PENCIL METHOD

Hold the hook like a pencil, in your right hand (if you're right-handed), about 3-5cm from the hooked end. If your hook has a flat area, you'll find it comfortable to hold it here.



KNIFE METHOD

Hold the hook between your thumb and forefinger, about 3-5cm from the hooked end, resting the end of the hook against your palm. This will give you lots of control.

HOLDING THE YARN

Even tension results in even stitches



METHOD ONE

Pass the ball end of the yarn between the little finger and third fingers of your left hand (if you are right-handed), then behind the third and middle fingers, over your index finger.



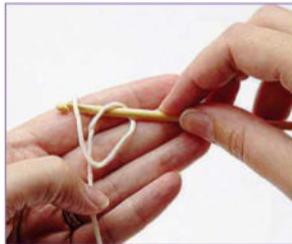
METHOD TWO

Loop the ball end of the yarn loosely around the little finger of your left hand, then take it over the third finger, behind the middle finger and over your index finger.

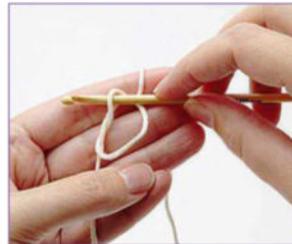
MAKING A SLIPKNOT The first loop on the hook



1 Hold the tail of the ball of yarn in your left hand and drape the yarn clockwise over the top of it to form a loose, circular loop.



2 Hold the loop between left thumb and forefinger, then insert the crochet hook through the centre of the loop from front to back.



3 Catch the ball end of the yarn with the hook and pull it back through the centre of the loop, taking the yarn through with it.



4 Pull both ends of the yarn to tighten the knot, then pull just the ball end to tighten the loop so it's close to the hook, but not touching it.

CHAIN STITCH Use this stitch to make your foundation chain



1 Hold the hook in your right hand, and both the yarn end and the working yarn in your left hand. Move the hook under and over the yarn to wrap it around anticlockwise.



2 Pull the hook towards the slipknot, catching the yarn in the hook, and pulling it through the slipknot loop. This forms your first chain (ch) stitch. Repeat steps 1 and 2 to form a chain length.



3 This is what your row of chains will look like. Hold the chain with your left hand near the hook, to keep the tension. Keep going until you have the number of chains that's stated in your pattern.

How to count chains



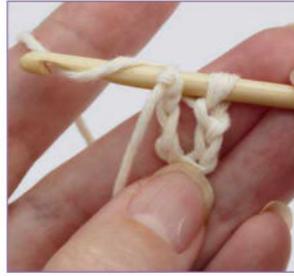
Each chain or loop counts as one stitch. Never count your first slipknot or the loop on the hook (called the working loop). So that you can be accurate, make sure the chain is not twisted and that the front is facing you.

SLIP STITCH (ss)

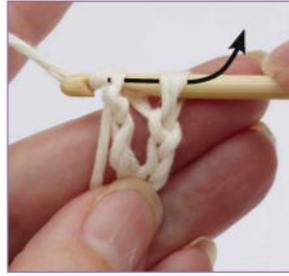
This stitch has no height – often used to join rounds



1 You can make a slip stitch in any chain or stitch, to join it to the working loop on the hook. To make a slip stitch, simply insert the hook into the stitch indicated, from front to back.



2 Catch the ball end of the yarn with the hook, so the yarn wraps anticlockwise around it (yarn round hook, or yrh).



3 Gently pull the hook, and the yarn wrapped around it, back towards the 2 loops on the hook. Draw the yarn through both the loops on the hook.



4 This will finish the stitch and you'll see how the slip stitch has joined the working loop to the chain or stitch you inserted the hook into. You can also use slip stitch to form a neat edging.

DOUBLE CROCHET (dc) US term: single crochet

One of the key stitches in crochet, doubles are simple, compact stitches that form a dense fabric



1 To make a double crochet stitch, insert the hook under the top 2 loops of the next stitch on the previous



2 Wind the yarn around the hook (yrh).



3 Pull the yarn through the stitch, giving you 2 loops on your crochet hook.



4 Yarn round hook again, then pull the yarn through both loops. There's your double crochet made and you'll have one loop left on the hook, ready to do the next stitch.

HALF TREBLE CROCHET (htr) US term: half double crochet

A handy stitch that's between double and treble crochet in size, and it looks slightly looser than double crochet



1 To make a half treble crochet stitch, work to where you want the htr and then wind the yarn round the hook (yrh).



2 Insert the hook under the top 2 loops of the next stitch in the previous row. Wrap yarn around the hook again (yrh).



3 Pull the yarn through the stitch only (3 loops on hook).



4 Yarn round hook again, pull the yarn through all 3 loops. You've made a half treble crochet. Continue working htr into next and following sts to the end of the row.

TREBLE CROCHET (tr) US term: double crochet

One of the most popular stitches in crochet, this simple stitch is twice as high as a double crochet stitch



1 To work a treble crochet, start by winding yrh and then insert the hook under the top 2 loops of the stitch on the previous row.



2 Wrap the yarn around the hook (yrh) and pull the yarn through the stitch only.



3 You will now have 3 loops on the hook. Yrh again, and draw the yarn through just the first 2 loops on the hook.



4 You will now have 2 loops on the hook. Yrh again and draw the yarn through the remaining loops on the hook. Your treble crochet is complete.

WORKING IN ROWS

Follow these simple rules to construct crochet fabric



1 The first row is made by working across the foundation chain from right to left. At the end of the chain or row, turn the work so that the yarn is behind the hook.



2 For the next row, first make the turning chain for the stitch you're about to work (see opposite). Now work the next stitch into the top of the stitches on your first row, missing the first stitch.

WORKING STITCHES INTO A RING

To make circles, tubes and other shapes



1 Make a foundation ring and work the t-ch (3ch for treble sts). Work a treble st as usual, but insert hook into centre of ring. For treble sts, yrh, insert hook into ring.



2 Finish the treble, as usual (yrh, pull yarn through ring, yrh, pull yarn through first 2 loops, yrh, pull yarn through 2 loops). Work more sts into the ring as needed.

DOUBLE TREBLE CROCHET (dtr)

US term: treble crochet

This is a stitch regularly used as an elongated version of the treble (described above). It's worked in a very similar way to the treble, as follows:

- 1** Make a foundation chain. Skip 4ch, *yrh twice, and insert the hook under the top loop of the next ch.
- 2** Yrh, pull the yarn through the ch loop only (4 loops on hook).
- 3** Yrh and pull the yarn through 2 loops only (3 loops on hook).

Yrh and pull the yarn through 2 loops only (2 loops on hook).

4 Yrh and pull the yarn through the remaining 2 loops. Repeat from * to make more dtr sts.

5 To make the next row of dtr, turn work and ch4. This turning chain counts as the first dtr in a new row. Skip first st at the base of the t-ch, work 1dtr under the top 2 loops of the second stitch in the previous row; continue to the end of the row.

TRIPLE TREBLE CROCHET (ttr)

US term: double treble crochet

This is one of the longest standard crochet stitches and is mainly used in fancy stitch patterns. It's taller than a double treble crochet stitch (described left) and is worked in a very similar way, as follows:

- 1** Make a foundation ch. Skip 5 ch, *yrh 3 times, insert hook under top loop of next ch.
- 2** Yrh, pull yarn through ch loop only (5 loops on hook).
- 3** † Yrh, draw loop through

2 loops only. Repeat from † 3 times more and your triple treble will be finished. Repeat from * to make more ttr sts.

4 To make the next row, turn work and ch5. This turning chain counts as the first triple treble in a new row. Skip first st at base of the t-ch. Work 1 triple treble, inserting hook under the top 2 loops of the second st in the previous row; continue to the end of the row.
